I prefer taking them to Staples as they give me credit for up to ten

cartridges a month. I just bag them in groups of ten and each month drop a bag off when I'm near a Staples.

About a month later I get an email from Staples with up to a \$20 credit, which I can use in the store. This year my timing was perfect. In June, July, and August I receive credits and used them for school supplies already on sale. That made the \$60 FREE MONEY even better! —Carol Fruehling

Free Money—Can You Hear Me Now?

Do I have your attention? Yes, I said free money. Thrivent Action Team Dollars are available to every Thrivent member. You are eligible for two \$250 Visa cards per calendar year.

The first thing you need to do is come up with an idea for helping others through an Action Team project. Members of our congregation have used their dollars for various LWR projects as well as local needs in our community. Examples of our projects are as follows:

- Supplies for LWR quilts, personal care kits, school kits and sewing kits.
- New crib sheets made for the ECC at CTR. Fabric was purchased with the grant money and the members of Sew 'n Sows made the sheets.
- Provided additional food for the South Tulsa Neighborhood House
- Groceries to provide a meal at an LWR quilt supply fundraiser
- Truck rental and transportation for the LWR boxes to Wichita, KS
- Pillow cases for The Children's Hospital at Saint Francis

Once you have come up with your idea, chosen a date for the project and put your team together, you will need to go online to thrivent.com/actionteam to get started. (Continued on page 9.)

The application process is simple and should not take you any longer than fifteen minutes to complete. You will need to know the t-shirt size needed for each team member as Thrivent provides t-shirts for advertising. My experience is that Thrivent will notify you in 1-5 business days concerning the status of your application. If you do not hear from them in that amount of time, check your Spam/Junk folders as your server may have sent it there. I once found my acceptance letter there. Once given the green light for your project, you will receive a box in the mail with the t-shirts, banner, Visa card, packet, etc. It is all very self-explanatory.

Once you have received your acceptance email, you need to begin advertising for your event. The idea for the Action Teams is for this to be your seed money. Hopefully you will receive other donations as well as lots of help. You will want to get as many people involved with the project as possible.

Once your project is complete, you will need to once again go online to thrivent.com/actionteam and share your story and photos. Be sure you have someone taking photos along the way. We even take photos as we are doing our shopping. You would be surprised how you can inform others in your community about Thrivent and LWR when you ask them to take a photo of you shopping for supplies.

If you have any further questions, especially once you receive your packet in the mail, I have found the Thrivent customer service representatives to be extremely helpful. The Lutheran Witness had a very good article titled Spring Into Action in the June 2017 issue. The article will be a good reference for you.




