Happy New Year! Can you believe its 2022? Of course you can, we are in it; ready or not! Those words, "ready or not", remind me of hide and seek when I was little, growing up on Rockwell Dr in Clinton, Maryland. Those are the words that would be yelled at the top of the voice of the one who was "it". "Ready or not, here I come", meant that you had better be in your hiding place. I have to admit, I never liked hiding. I was always afraid that the seeker was just around the corner and in any moment would scare me to death. I was not afraid of being caught. I was afraid of being scared suddenly with a loud "I gotcha".I always liked being "it", or being the seeker. I wanted to be the one who scared the others out of their wits. The funny thing is, now that I think about it; they never really seemed as frightened as I thought I was. So it was always a let down.

But most importantly, we are grateful for the forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation that come only from our Lord Jesus Christ.

Do I HAVE to Forgive?

Traveling on the ICE bullet train today, I walked to the dining car to have a cup of coffee. I saw a young German soldier sitting at a table and asked whether I might sit across from him. I thanked him for his service, and we chatted a bit. He said he has only been in three months, but his dream is to join the KSK (Special Forces). I told him that was a tough but admirable goal. He asked me what I do. I replied that I am a missionary -a pastor telling migrants about Jesus. At that point, he said, "If you are a pastor, I have a question: Do I have to forgive?" I asked him, "Are you a Christian?" "I'm an atheist," he replied. "Well, if you were a Christian, you'd have to forgive. After all, Jesus taught us to pray, 'Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us.' But even if you are not a believer, you should still forgive. If you hold that



bitterness inside of you, over time it's going to eat you up. It's like a boil. It has to be lanced so you can let all that pus and bitterness run off." "It's my mother..." he said, "and what she did to me when I was a kid. I haven't been in touch with her for 7 or 8 years." "Write her a letter for Christmas," I suggested. "Tell her you forgive her. You will find it liberating. And it might be one of the best Christmas presents she will ever receive. And by the way, I don't think you are really an atheist. They're quite rare." "Actually, I was baptized Protestant," he admitted. "Well, in that case, let's just say you've taken a temporary detour from Christ. Remember, even 'If we are faithless, He remains faithful' (2 Timothy 2:13)." "Thank you for saying that...Somehow I feel it was providential that we met today. Too bad I must get off here. I have so many more questions. Is there any way I can stay in touch with you?" I gave him my number." The ICE had barely pulled out of the station when I got a next: "My name is so-and-so. We just met on the train. Let's stay in touch." Thank you, Jesus, for another everyday miracle.

And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year: "Give me a light that I may tread safely into the

unknown."

And he replied:

"Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God.

That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way."

So I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night.

And He led me towards the hills and the breaking of day in the lone East.

Thus reads the preamble to the poem God Knows, written in 1908 by British poet, missionary, and academic ⁴Minnie Louise Haskins. I first became acquainted with this text through The Gate of the Year, an anthem that the Chancel Choir of the Kirk of Kildaire Presbyterian in Cary, North Carolina would sing each year on the first Sunday of a new calendar year. I greatly enjoyed accompanying this piece and it always seemed to me to be a fitting way to begin a new year.

The preamble to God Knows gained widespread public attention in 1939 when King George VI quoted a portion of it in his annual Christmas radio broadcast to the British Empire. Lovely though the language of the wellknown preamble is, the rest of the poem is well worth reading and considering as we enter into the year 2022:

So heart be still: What need our little life Our human life to know, if God hath comprehension? In all the dizzy strife of things both high and low, God hideth His intention.

God knows. His will is best. The stretch of years Which wind ahead, so dim to our imperfect vision, Are clear to God. Our fears are premature; In Him, All time hath full provision.

Then rest: until God moves to lift the veil

From our impatient eyes, when, as the sweeter features Of Life's stern face we hail, fair beyond all surmise God's thought around His creaturesour mind shall fill. The sentiments expressed in this poem bring to mind the words of two chorales with deep roots in the Lutheran hymnic tradition: If Thou But Trust in God to Guide Thee and What God Ordains is Always Good. These hymns remind us that while we cannot see what the future holds, we live in the sure and certain hope that the One who created the universe holds our past, our present, and our future in His hands.

If thou but trust in God to guide thee And hope in Him through all thy ways, He'll give thee strength, whate'er betide thee, And bear thee through the evil days. Who trusts in God's unchanging love Builds on the rock that naught can move. (If Thou But Trust in God to Guide Thee, LSB 750, text by Georg Neumark)

What God ordains is always good: This truth remains unshaken.

Though sorrow, need, or death be mine, I shall not be forsaken.

I fear no harm, for with His arm

He shall embrace and shield me; so to my God I yield me.

(What God Ordains is Always Good, LSB 760, text by Samuel Rodigast)

In closing, here is a Collect that is often prayed during times of travel. In this new year, may these words remind you of the comfort and hope that are ours in the saving, redemptive works of Jesus Christ.

Lord God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Jacob worked for months with kids, teaching them songs in preparation for the Christmas program.




