Look up information on the Dead Sea Scrolls and write a few short sentences/paragraphs about what you found out and what they are.



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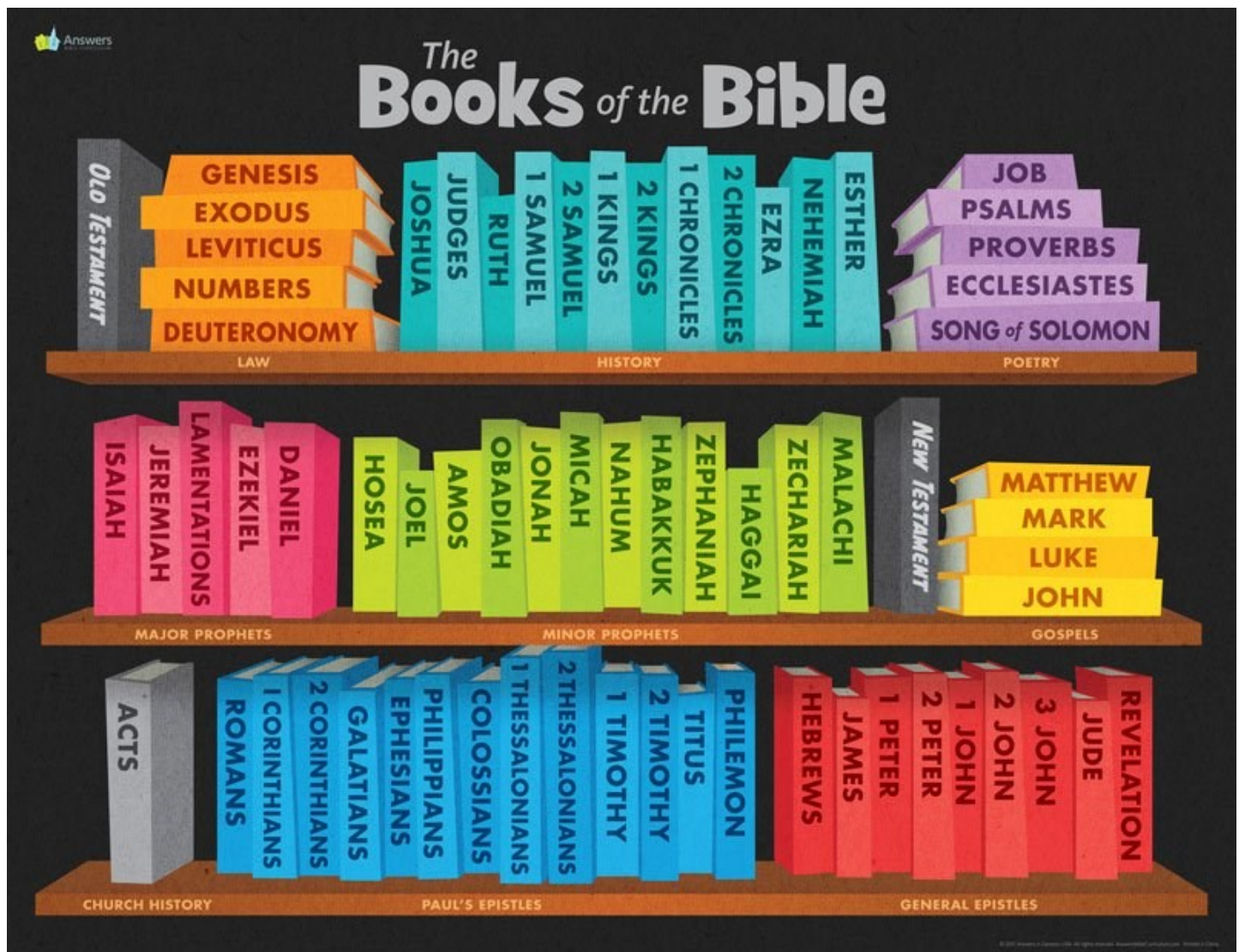

Martin Luther's explanation of the First Commandment, "You shall have no other gods." is this:

*What does this mean? We should fear, love, and trust in God above all things.*

Look back at Lesson 10. What difference would it have made if the Israelites had feared, loved and trusted God above all things?
