A Letter From The Pastor

Fellow Redeemed,

The world is full of worry. It has been true for quite a long time. It seems to have gotten a lot worse though, with the advent of Covid, variants and now Omicron, not to mention it is currently cold and flu season. That being said, we pray for the doctors, nurses and all medical professionals who are on the front lines battling disease. It is not easy for them and there is often much to worry about. I often wonder if there is a fix for the things that cause us to worry. I am not sure you can call it a fix, as much as you can call it an antidote for worry. Listen to the sermon that Jesus preaches in Galilee.

Jesus preached, "Therefore I tell you, do not worry about your life, what you will eat or drink; or about your body what you will wear. Is not life more important than food, and the body more important than clothes? Look at the birds of the air; they do not sow or reap or store away in barns, and yet your heavenly Father feeds them. Are you not much more valuable than they? Who of you by worrying can add a single hour to his life?"

I remember the first time I read these words. It was in 1993 and Denise and I had just started going back to church. We were attending Trinity Lutheran Church in Downtown, Orlando and if I may confess, I was struggling with finances. We were not struggling financially, but I was struggling with my attitude concerning finances. I remember my worldly heart saying, "I deserve more and/or I deserve better

financially than what the government was currently paying me, as a civil servant working for the Department of the Navy. I was so naive. I said a prayer to God. "Lord, I am going to open this Bible and you give me the answer to why I don't make more money!", was my prayer. I opened the Bible to Matthew 6:25, and my eyes went straight to the verse above. I was so scared. God had just answered me! I threw the Bible down on the couch, scared and bewildered that God would work in such a way, and so immediately. God, why don't I (fill in the blank). The answer is, "do not worry, I got you, and I, God, am working for you and through you." My confirmation verse comes barreling in like a freight train here. Romans 8:28 "And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose."

To this day, I am in awe of how mighty God is and how he is attentive to all of our needs. He works everything for good, and he has called us according to his purpose. We truly have nothing to worry about. Does that mean we should not be diligent, by no means. But there is a chasm between worry and diligence. I don't think disease will ever go away, or be completely cured. I know that God is good and that he is working all things, in heaven and on earth, for our good. So, I will not worry, because God has given his Son, who has atoned for the sins of the world, and through him we have life, light and immortality.

Seminary News

Well, the big holiday season is over. We were blessed to get together with all our boys for the first time in several years. We also went back to Tulsa, our adopted home city. It was good to be back. We didn't get to see everyone that we wanted, but as usual, I had to get back for a class that started on January 3rd. It is always good to see friends and family.

Classes last semester were particularly difficult, yet I managed to do well grade wise. Between the end of Fall Semester and the beginning of Spring Semester we have a two week long class in the Winterim session. The class I am taking is called Introduction to Pastoral Leadership. We have been exploring the role of the Pastor as a leader in different size congregations, as the size of the congregation many times dictates the way a congregation organizes itself. The way the congregation organizes itself then determines the type of leadership required of the Pastor. It has helped us Seminarians to discover what size congregation we might be equipped to serve and what skills, knowledge, and wisdom we need to seek out to be the most effective shepherd we can be.

This class has caused me to reflect over the Pastors that I know in the past and present. I am truly grateful to God that He has led me to have a variety of experiences and serve with and under so many servants in the ministry. When I started out in professional ministry over 30 years ago it would have been helpful to have the information that I have now. It would have changed the way I thought about the church and ministry and how to best work with and support my Pastors. It is both intimidating and humbling to think that I, Lord willing, will take on the same mantel in a few years. I have so much to learn before I do. Thankfully, I have some time.

Typically, I would have an internship next year called a "Vicarage". Normally I would work under a Pastor in a church that I was assigned to by Dr. Nielsen. Because there are so many young men that have heeded the call to attend Seminary either in Ft. Wayne or St. Louis, there are not enough congregations that accept the responsibility of training a Vicar. Dr. Nielsen asked me to consider a delayed Vicarage to a congregation that does not have a Pastor. If all parties were agreeable, then the following year the Vicarage would convert to a Call to the same congregation. I have consented to the arrangement and so Deb and I will stay at Seminary next year while most of my classmates go out on their Vicarages.

It will be challenging, and I covet your prayers as I continue to attempt to drink from the firehose of knowledge and wisdom that the Seminary offers. I am also grateful for your financial support. We are blessed to have so many who have answered the call to support us in this endeavor. We could not do it without you.

God's Word tells us in 1 Timothy 6:17-19, "As for the rich in this present age, charge them not to be haughty, nor to set their hopes on the uncertainty of riches, but on God, who richly provides us with everything to enjoy. They are to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous and ready to share, thus storing up treasure for themselves as a good foundation for the future, so that they may take hold of that which is truly life." (ESV, emphasis added)

Several times during our congregational meeting on January 23, Lay Ministry leaders and church staff noted how generous God has been to our congregation at Christ the Redeemer. God's goodness to us has been shown through the gracious generosity of so many of you.

Even during a time of COVID and economic uncertainty, we have:

- Collected \$2.7 million for our building program, \$200,000 MORE than what was originally pledged. And donations are still coming in!
- Ended 2021 with an accumulated operating surplus of \$352,000.
- Received 2021 regular offerings almost \$100,000 more than what was originally budgeted for 2021.
- Collected pledges for 2022 at an amount more than 26% higher than for 2021.

The money itself is NOT the point. Based on YOUR generosity, as God has moved this congregation, we have been blessed to be able to:

- Make another wonderful addition (Nikki Boyd) to our already great church staff in 2021 and beyond.
- Allow for regular mortgage payments to pay off our new building construction.
- NOT need to ask ANY of our Lay Ministries to reduce their 2022 budget requests. (This is the first time since I have been a member of this congregation that this has happened to my recollection.)
- Plan to renew some of our beloved Ministry activities (like our Fall Festival) and dream of new ways to serve God's people in our community.

Again, I am not excited because of the money and finances. I am just so hopeful about what God has planned for us to do in 2022 and beyond.

MUSIC MINISTRY

CHOIR & HANDBELLS FOR YOUTH & ADULTS

Music is a vital part of worship here at Christ the Redeemer. Musicians of all ages and experience levels give glory to God by making a joyful noise to the Lord in the Divine Service. Below are brief descriptions of some of the various ensembles that comprise the music ministry at CTR and information on when each group meets to rehearse.

Agapé Ringers: Middle school students-Adults – Mondays, 7:30 PM

This handbell ensemble provides music during worship services throughout the Church year. A variety of handbell literature, including hymn settings, classical transcriptions, original bell compositions, and choral accompaniments, are utilized. Prior ringing experience is not necessary, although some music reading ability is helpful. Basic training in ringing technique will be provided for anyone new to handbells. New members are welcome at any time!

Peace Choir: K-5th Grade students – Wednesdays, 5:30 PM

This children's choir meets on Wednesday evenings during CTR-U and during the Sunday school hour on alternating Sunday mornings. During rehearsals, the children are introduced to a wide variety of Christian music. In addition to singing, the students often incorporate chimes and various world percussion instruments as they explore sacred music from many backgrounds. Through participation in this ensemble, children also learn about the liturgy, the Church year, and how to be active participants in worship services.

Praise Ringers: High school students – Wednesdays, 6:00 PM

This handbell ensemble for high school students rehearses on Wednesday evenings during CTR-U. The students learn to play a wide variety of progressively more challenging handbell repertoire in a variety of styles utilizing the full gamut of ringing techniques.

Sanctuary Choir: High school students-Adults – Wednesdays, 7:00 PM

The Sanctuary Choir sings in worship services regularly throughout the Church year. This choir supports and enriches the congregational singing of hymns, psalms, and the liturgy. They also provide musical offerings, drawing from the rich heritage of sacred choral music from the Christian church around the world and throughout the centuries. No prior choral experience is necessary. We would love to have you sing with us!

Instrumentalists: Middle school students-Adults – Rehearsals scheduled as needed

Instrumentalists provide musical leadership in our worship services throughout the year. Musical contributions by soloists or small ensembles include instrumental pieces, choral accompaniments, and supporting congregational singing through inventive hymn settings. Brass, woodwind, string, keyboard, and percussion players are all welcome!



Prayers for our quilt program are needed plus prayers for the recipients of our quilts. These quilts are sent all over the United States, as well as the world!



- 1 package unflavored gelatin
- ¾ cup very warm water
- 1 tsp salt
- ¾ cup gel body wash
- Food coloring
- Rubbing alcohol in spray bottle
- Silicone baking molds

What you do:

- In a bowl, stir gelatin and warm water until dissolved.
- 2. Add salt, body wash and a few drops of food coloring. Stir.
- Spray molds with rubbing alcohol (to prevent bubbles). Place molds on a tray.
- 4. Pour mixture into the molds. Refrigerate until set, about two hours.
- Pop soap out of molds and store in an airtight container.


