A Letter From The Pastor

Fellow Redeemed,

My Grace is sufficient for you. These are the words of revelation given to Paul when he prayed to the Lord that a thorn in the flesh might be removed from him. These words are recorded in 2 Corinthians 12:9. We view weakness as the absence of power. God reveals the fact that His power is actually manifest in and through weakness. Not only that, but God reveals that His power is made perfect in weakness. So, are you feeling weak? Good, God is at work! Are you feeling insufficient? Good, God's Grace alone is sufficient! When you couple this revelation from God with the Beatitudes of Luke 6:20-23, we come to a realization that God's ways are not our ways, and neither are His thoughts the same as our thoughts.

"Blessed are you who are poor, for yours is the kingdom of God.Blessed are you who are hungry now, for you shall be satisfied. Blessed are you who weep now, for you shall laugh. Blessed are you when people hate you and when they exclude you and revile you and spurn your name as evil, on account of the Son of Man! Rejoice in that day, and leap for joy, for behold, your reward is great in heaven; for so their fathers did to the prophets."

These words from Jesus cut deep and they can cause confusion for those who do not have faith in Him. The confusion is lifted and faith clears the eyes to see, that when we follow Jesus, we are reliant on Him. In sin, we think we are selfreliant. When the Word of God comes, we see just how reliant we are on God to do all things, and complete all things, and to accomplish all things; not the least of which is our salvation, through Jesus Christ. Blessed are you and I, because of God's Son. Blessed are you and I, as the Word of God brings us to the humility of Christ, where we ourselves are humbled; completely. Blessed are you and I, when we like Paul, are called to suffer any thorn in the flesh. Rejoice and be glad, because God is working His power for your good, and the perfection of God's power is the fruit of faith in lives that are completely turned over to Him in faith. Blessed? Yes, but only by the sufficient Grace of God through Jesus Christ. Amen!

Supporting and Lifting Up Those Who Serve Overseas

CTR currently is supporting 3 overseas missionaries through LCMS Mission Central. LCMS missionaries must raise their own funding – including transportation, housing, materials, and technology tools. Your support for them is funded with Outreach budgeted funds. You are encouraged to pray daily for these dedicated servants of God. You also must help us by prayer, so that many will give thanks on our behalf for the blessing granted us through the prayers of many (2 Corinthians 1:11).

Rev. Dale and Suzanne Kaster are missionaries to Czech Republic.



They live in Prague. Dale trains men to be pastors of the Lutheran Evangelical Church of the Augsburg confession in the Czech Republic (ECAVvCR). He also serves as the pastor of an English language Lutheran Church in Prague, which serves the LCMS Eurasia regional office staff and many English-speaking expats living in Prague. In addition, Dale assists the regional chaplain with pastoral service to the LCMS missionaries serving the Silesian region of the Czech Republic. Currently, Dale and Suzanne are in the United States dealing with his diagnosis of multiple myeloma. Please pray that this level of the disease will hold. Pray also that a working relationship between the U.S. doctor and the Czech doctor will be able to establish a working relationship. Your prayers are greatly appreciated.



Rev. Christian and Lula Tiews serve the Lord as career missionaries through LCMS in Germany.

As a missionary pastor, Christian works with the Independent Evangelical Lutheran Church (SELK), the Synod's partner church in Germany, to reach out to Germans and Farsi-speaking immigrants from the

Middle East. In addition, he offers English classes, translates English theological materials into German, and assists in the new English-language Bachelor of Theology program offered by Luther Academy, Riga (aka the Livonian Lutheran Project), as a mentor of future pastors and coordinator of other mentors throughout the Eurasia region. Chris and his wife, Lula were both born in Germany and later came to the United States in 1996. He served as pastor at Grace Lutheran in Tulsa and Trinity Lutheran Okmulgee. They have 6 children, one of whom, Lilian, is in Germany with them. Pray for the Holy Spirit to guide the Middle Eastern immigrants to a faith in the true God. Pray for Rev. Tiews to encounter both immigrants and U.S. military members that need to hear the saving Word of the Gospel and the love Christ has for them.



Rev. Martin and Marie Dicke are missionaries in Papua New Guinea.

Martin teaches music at Timothy Lutheran Seminary in Birip, develops worship resources for the Gutnius (Good News) Lutheran Church, leads workshops on worship and music and helps develop religious literature for the church. In addition, he facilitates the distribution of religious books to Lutheran schools in the Enga Province and serves as the PNG team manager. Marie is also into music. She enjoys cooking, gardening, the LWML, and quilting for Lutheran World Relief. Pray for wisdom in their service, boldness in their proclamation of faith and protection from those who would hinder it. Pray that the scourge of sorcery accusations-related violence may cease. Pray for the leaders, pastors and members of the Gutnius Lutheran Church in PNG.

MUSIC MINISTRY

CHOIR & HANDBELLS FOR YOUTH & ADULTS BY JACOB DRENGLER

Since October, I have endeavored to expand and broaden the repertoire of hymns that we sing in our worship lives together here at Christ the Redeemer. I have attempted to do this by selecting a Hymn of the Season (not dissimilar in concept to the Hymns of the Day that we sing each week). For the Hymns of the Season, I have chosen a number of hymns based on the seasons of the Church year. We have then sung those hymns in worship for several weeks in a row as a way of beginning to ingrain those great hymns of the faith in our communal memory. Below are the hymns that we have sung as part of this effort thus far:

October (Season after Pentecost): Evening and Morning (LSB 726)

November (Season after Pentecost): God's Own Child, I Gladly Say It (LSB 594)

Advent: Lo! He Comes with Clouds Descending (LSB 336)

January (Baptism Of Our Lord-Sundays after the Epiphany): O Blessed Spring (LSB 595)

February (Sundays after the Epiphany-Transfiguration Sunday): Voices Raised to You We Offer (LSB 795)

This brings us to the hymn for the penitential season of Lent. Among the most striking Lenten hymns found in Lutheran Service Book is "In Silent Pain the Eternal Son" (LSB 432) by Anglican priest and hymnodist Christopher Idle (b. 1938). This hymn, originally titled "Strangest Victory," was conceived to fill a perceived lack of hymnody that deals with the subject of atonement. Idle has noted that many hymn writers have penned hymns that display Christ's majesty and power but rarely His cross (Lutheran Service Book: Companion to the Hymns, p. 263).

In silent pain, the eternal Son hangs derelict and still; In darkened day his work is done, fulfilled, his Father's will. Uplifted for the world to see, he hangs in strangest victory, For in his body on the tree, he carries all our ill.

He died that we might die to sin and live for righteousness; The earth is stained to make us clean and bring us into peace. For peace he came, and met its cost; he gave himself to save the lost; He loved us to the uttermost and paid for our release.

For strife he came, to bring a sword, the truth to end all lies;
To rule in us, our patient Lord, until all evil dies:
For in his hand he holds the stars, his voice shall speak to end our wars,
And those who love him see his scars and look into his eyes.

The opening stanza begins with a grim image, one which many of us likely prefer not to contemplate, much less sing about: the image of the Christ hanging dead on the cross. In just a few words, we are reminded of the awful price paid on our behalf to fulfill God's plan of salvation. It is a strange form of victory that we bear witness to when we sing the story of Christ's Passion and death. And yet...

Yet we know that this is not the end. We know something that those who were witnesses to that brutal execution did not know as they watched the events of that Friday unfold. Simply put: it's Friday, but Sunday is coming! That Sunday brings with it the Resurrection dawn. That Sunday brings forth songs of victory. That Sunday heralds life triumphant over death. And so we sing!

We sing songs that affirm the knowledge that Christ's hands, scarred with the marks of death, hold the stars in their courses. We sing songs of a Christ whose voice shall speak to end our human wars and conflicts, ushering in a radically reordered kingdom of peace, where the first shall be last and the last shall be first. We sing songs of hope, justice, peace, and love in a world that so desperately needs to be made whole. We sing these songs, even (perhaps especially) in times of social, political, and economic upheaval. In times when so many things seem to be uncertain, we, Easter people, even in the midst of Lenten wilderness, live in the certain hope that Jesus is risen and that he walks beside us.


SUNDAY SCHOOL CLASSES FOR ALL AGES BEGIN MARCH 6

Mite Explanation and History

Based on the Biblical account of the widow's mite (Luke 21:1-4), the Mite Box is intended for regular contributions of "mites" - offerings above and beyond the support given to congregations and the LCMS. Mite Box contributions amount to millions of dollars that fund district and national mission grants and implement the LWML program.

Mite Boxes - How They Began

Perhaps inspired by the various "cent" or "mite" societies of the early 1800s, the Woman's Mission to Woman urged members in its first circular letter in 1871 to use their new Mite Box to raise funds. The entire family was encouraged to contribute. The garnet-colored paper box had an opening on the top and the words, "Woman's Mission to Woman," in gold letters on the side.

LWML Mite Boxes

Over the years, many Lutheran Ladies Aid societies used a box to gather funds in support of local and synod ministries. Under the original 1928 Lutheran Women's Missionary Endeavor organizational plan, each woman in every congregation would receive a Mite Box if she participated in Ladies Aid. Receipts from the 92 Ladies Aid societies totaled \$6,651.31 in 1930.

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League, formally recognized by the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod in 1942, required by the newly adopted constitution and bylaws, that 25% of all missionary contributions be given to the national organization, shared from the districts. Leaguers are reminded to not just tuck their Mite Box out of sight until meeting day, but instead to:

- -Put your pennies in the box at the end of each day
- -Say "thank you" with an appropriate amount whenever calamity or misfortune has been averted
- -Empty all your loose change from your kitchen coin bowl into the box on meeting day

Throughout the decades, Lutheran women have stepped out in faith, setting goals and trusting God to move the hearts of His people to give generously to LWML to proclaim the Gospel.
