SCHOOL KITS

SOME IMPORTANT GUIDELINES TO REMEMBER

- · If you are looking to purchase backpacks, the preferred style is often used in the U.S. for youth to carry athletic equipment. Try your local sporting goods store or search online using the keywords, "buy drawstring backpacks."
- · Before purchasing backpacks, make sure they meet the size requirements (14" x17") and General Assembly Instructions. You can download a list from our website of suppliers who have appropriate bags available for purchase in bulk.
- · Please give new items only.
- · Please do not donate items with any religious symbols, messages or your group's name.
- · Please do not donate any items decorated with a U.S. flag, patriotic or military symbols, or references to the armed forces, including camouflage.
- · Do not add other items or leave out any of the items listed.
- · Do not enclose the Kit or any of its contents in plastic bags.

School Kits provide normalcy in times of crisis

In northern Iraq, many families were unable to buy school supplies for their children when returning to their homes after years of ISIS conflict. The students couldn't complete their schoolwork; some skipped school entirely because they lacked basic supplies.

Thanks to a shipment of more than 13,000 LWR School Kits, students of all ages received what they needed to continue their education and return to the normalcy of a regular school routine. As school absences decrease and schoolwork is completed, students are beginning to heal from the trauma of witnessing violence and conflict.

INCLUDE THE FOLLOWING IN EACH SCHOOL KIT

- FOUR 70-sheet notebooks of wide- or college-ruled paper, approximately 8" x 10 ½"; no loose leaf paper
- ONE 30-centimeter ruler, or a ruler with centimeters on one side and inches on the other
- ONE pencil sharpener
- ONE pair of blunt scissors (safety scissors with embedded steel blades work well)
- FIVE unsharpened #2 pencils with erasers; secure together with a rubber band
- FIVE black or blue ballpoint pens (no gel ink); secure together with a rubber band
- ONE box of 16 or 24 crayons
- ONE 2 1/2" eraser
- ONE sturdy drawstring backpack-style cloth bag, approximately 14" x 17" with shoulder straps (no standard backpacks)

HOW TO PACK YOUR PROJECT PROMISE KITS

- · Place ruler between notebooks. Place all items neatly into the bag and draw the drawstring together.
- · Pack completed Kits, like items together, in boxes. Label contents in LARGE, BLOCK LETTERS on the outside of the boxes.
- Use strong cartons secured with packing tape. not to exceed 40 pounds.
- · Do not use plastic or paper bags to pack donations.
- Include the name and address of your group or congregation on each box and label the contents

In recent months, I have endeavored to expand and broaden the repertoire of hymns that we sing in worship together here at Christ the Redeemer. To that end, I have selected a series of Hymns of the Season, similar to the appointed Hymns of the Day that we sing each Sunday. For the Hymns of the Season, I have chosen a number of hymns based on the seasons of the Church year. We have then sung those hymns in worship for several weeks in a row, often as the Offertory Hymn. It is my hope that, through this practice, these great hymns of the faith have begun to be ingrained in our communal memory. So far, our Hymns of the Season have included:

October (Season after Pentecost): Evening and Morning (LSB 726) November (Season after Pentecost): God's Own Child, I Gladly Say It (LSB 594) Advent: Lo! He Comes with Clouds Descending (LSB 336) January (Baptism Of Our Lord-Sundays after the Epiphany): O Blessed Spring (LSB 595) February (Sundays after the Epiphany-Transfiguration Sunday): Voices Raised to You We Offer (LSB 795) Lent: In Silent Pain the Eternal Son (LSB 432) Easter: The Strife is o'er, the Battle Done (LSB 464) June: I Bind Unto Myself Today (LSB 604)

Beginning in July, we will begin a series of Hymns of the Season that are all hymns of praise and adoration. Praise is one of the chief functions of the Church's song as defined by Rev. Dr. Paul Westermeyer in his book The Church Musician:

"The church's song, especially for Protestants, is most obviously a song of praise. Many psalms—like 98, "O sing to the Lord a new song," or 100, which calls us to "come into God's presence with singing", or 150, where instruments and "everything that breathes" are all exhorted to praise the Lord—give expression to what is implicit throughout the Bible: God is to be praised, and music is one of the chief vehicles for expressing that praise" (Paul Westermeyer, The Church Musician, Augsburg Fortress, 1997, 31).

Praise in music takes many forms. Praise is found in the flowing, unison contours of Gregorian chant, the rugged declamation of Luther's chorales, the rich, highly complex polyphonic textures of J.S. Bach, and the earnest, deeply-felt yearning for justice found in African American spirituals. Praise is heard and expressed in all of these forms of music and many others, far too many to possibly fit within the scope of this article.

Our Hymn of the Season for July, and the first in our Hymns of Praise series, is "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty" (LSB 790). "Praise to the Lord" was written in 1680 by German Reformed theologian and hymnist Joachim Neander (1650-1680) and was published shortly before his untimely death of tuberculosis. Hymnologist Martin Roßler describes "Praise to the Lord" as "the number one hit among chorales, the bestseller on the hymn list, and anecdotally and statistically the most frequently sung hymn of all time." Many Lutherans, myself included, have sung this hymn several times a year their whole lives.

In Catherine Winkworth's English translation, each of the five stanzas of "Praise to the Lord, the Almighty" begins with the phrase "Praise to the Lord," echoing the language of the Psalms, particularly Psalms 146-150. Rev. Richard Resch describes singing this hymn as "a present-day form of that Old Testament praise." It is my hope that, each time we join our voices in this great hymn of the faith together this summer, you will be inspired to hear, sing, and understand these familiar words anew:

Praise to the Lord! O let all that is in me adore Him! All that has life and breath, come now with praises before Him! Let the Amen sound from his people again; Gladly forever adore Him!
