

BRAILLE MINISTRY AT CHRIST THE REDEEMER



We are pleased to announce that the Tulsa production center for Lutheran Braille Workers will soon be making its home at Christ the Redeemer. The Tulsa center has been around for almost 70 years and historically the local work of this ministry has been conducted at the Lutheran Church of Our Savior. Volunteers from Christ the Redeemer and other local Lutheran congregations meet regularly each month to produce Braille versions of the Bible. Recent changes to Our Savior's facilities have necessitated a move. This local production center is affiliated with the national Lutheran Braille Workers organization, which is an official service organization of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. CTR's own Patti Ross currently serves as the Vice President of the national organization's Board of Directors.

The Lutheran Braille Ministry will occupy the newly remodeled classroom at the southeast corner of our building (closest to the parking lot stairs and across from the older kitchen). Changes to the specific location in our building can be made in the future, as needed, but for now we believe that this room will work best for all.

There are currently five local Lutheran congregations that staff this production center each month. Their work occurs on weekdays beginning at 9:00 AM. Some groups work until noon and others work until 2:00 PM. Their activities will not cause any disruption to CTR's normal activities. We will plan to keep the room they occupy locked when not in use, simply to make sure that the equipment and supplies are not disturbed, but Floyd Lemons and all of the CTR Ministry Staff will be able to access the room as needed

Lutheran Braille Workers exists to bring the Word of God to the 253 million people throughout the world who are blind or visually impaired, completely free of charge, in Braille, specialized large print, and audiodigital formats. In its 78 year history, Lutheran Braille Workers has produced and distributed over 14 million volumes of Christian material, in almost 40 languages, to 164 countries. They have never charged a recipient to receive these materials as they believe financial ability should never prevent the Word of God from being shared with this underserved population.



MUSIC MINISTRY

Choir & Handbells for Youth & Adults

During the past ten months, I have endeavored to broaden the repertoire of hymns that we sing in worship together here at Christ the Redeemer. To that end, I have selected a series of Hymns of the Season, similar to the appointed Hymns of the Day that we sing each Sunday. For the Hymns of the Season, I have chosen a number of hymns based on the seasons of the Church year. We have then sung those hymns in worship for several weeks in a row, often as the Offertory Hymn. It is my hope that, through this practice, these great hymns of the faith have begun to be ingrained more deeply in our communal memory. So far, our Hymns of the Season have included:

October (Season after Pentecost): Evening and Morning (LSB 726) November (Season after Pentecost): God's Own Child, I Gladly Say It (LSB 594) Advent: Lo! He Comes with Clouds Descending (LSB 336) January (Baptism Of Our Lord-Sundays after the Epiphany): O Blessed Spring (LSB 595) February (Sundays after the Epiphany-Transfiguration Sunday): Voices Raised to You We Offer (LSB 795) Lent: In Silent Pain the Eternal Son (LSB 432) Easter: The Strife is o'er, the Battle Done (LSB 464) June: I Bind Unto Myself Today (LSB 604) July: Praise to the Lord, the Almighty (LSB 790)

This month, we will continue our mini-series of Hymns of the Season that are hymns of praise and adoration. The Hymn of the Season for August will be Praise, My Soul, the King of Heaven (LSB 793). This hymn, one of the most popular to emerge from the Anglican Church, is widely sung by a variety of mainline denominations. It is often chosen as an opening hymn for occasions of great pomp and circumstance; notably, it was selected as the processional hymn for the wedding of Queen Elizabeth II to Prince Philip in 1947.

The hymn text, written by Anglican priest Henry Francis Lyte (1793-1847), takes the form of a metrical paraphrase of Psalm 103. A metrical psalm is a translation of a psalm into rhyming language within a strict poetic meter. The practice of translating the psalms into metric forms for congregational singing was a central feature of liturgical song in the Reformed tradition and continues to be found in the works of contemporary hymnists today.

The first stanza is derived from the first verses of Psalm 103, drawing especially from verses one through three: "Bless the Lord, O my soul, and all that is within me, bless His holy name! Bless the Lord, O my soul, and forget not all his benefits, who forgives all your iniquity, who heals all your diseases."

Praise, my soul, the King of heaven; to His feet your tribute bring; Ransomed, healed, restored, forgiven, evermore His praises sing; Alleluia, alleluia, praise the everlasting King.

In the second and third stanzas, we are invited to join together to praise the One who, through His redeeming act of love in sending Jesus Christ, shows us "grace and favor," rescuing us from "all our foes," that is, from sin, death, and the power of the devil. The final stanza paints a vivid picture of worship by the angels who are before the throne of God in heaven, joining their voices with sun, moon, mortals, and all creation in an unending hymn of praise. Through the words of the Psalmist and the redemption that is ours through Jesus Christ, we are empowered to join our voices with theirs both in the here and now of time and space and, at the coming of Christ, there and then in eternity.

As we join our voices in the words of this hymn in the coming weeks, may it be a foretaste for you of the song of the new Jerusalem, a song that we will one day sing together before the throne of the Lamb in His kingdom that will not end.

Angels, help us to adore Him; You behold Him face to face. Sun and moon, bow down before Him, all who dwell in time and space. Alleluia, alleluia! Praise with us the God of grace.





As it stands now we should have the newly remodeled restrooms near the southwest entrance operational within the next few weeks. These restrooms will give us two great sets of user friendly multiple stall restrooms that are convenient to just about any location in our facility.

The sanctuary remodel continues to be challenging primarily due to supply issues associated with production of the skylights. The distributor responsible for final fabrication and installation received the material for one skylight rather than the three required for the


project. It has taken us 4 weeks just to find out that there was a misunderstanding by the manufacturer who didn't realize that there were three. They have a lot of the preliminary components cut to size for the other two but are waiting on the special custom color paint to apply to these components so that final fabrication can be completed.

Work continues to be done finalizing the upgraded sanctuary lighting selections and hope to have that nailed down soon.

We will keep the congregation posted as new information becomes available and appreciate everyone's patience.







ENDOWMENT FUND REPORT



As of June 30, 2022 the Endowment Fund has a total of \$929,722.40

Through the Endowment funds, the committee has agreed to fund the replacement of the three skylights in the Sanctuary of the Church, up to \$150,000. This is still an ongoing process and the final dollar amount has still not been determined.




