



During the past year, it has been my goal to broaden the repertory of hymns that we sing together in worship here at Christ the Redeemer. To that end, I have selected a series of Hymns of the Season, similar in concept to the appointed Hymns of the Day that we sing each Sunday. It is my hope that, through the practice of singing each of these hymns repeatedly over the course of several weeks, these great hymns of the faith have begun to be ingrained more deeply in our communal memory.

This month, we will continue our mini-series of Hymns of the Season that are hymns of praise and adoration. The Hymn of the Season for October is "We Praise You and Acknowledge You, O God." (LSB 941). This stirring hymn joins American Lutheran pastor and hymnwriter Stephen Starke's (b. 1955) English paraphrase of the ancient Latin hymn, Te Deum laudamus, to Gustav Holst's (1874-1934) stately hymn tune THAXTED.

Te Deum laudamus, a Latin hymn of praise that is among the oldest in the corpus of western Christian hymnody, likely originated in the fourth or early fifth century. Over the centuries, it has been joined to a myriad of musical settings and translated into a variety of languages. Martin Luther wrote both prose and verse German translations of the Te Deum. Luther's versification was later surpassed in popularity by a second German version, "Großer Gott! Wir loben dich," written by Ignaz Franz, a Roman Catholic priest, in 1768. This hymn, called the "German Te Deum" remains among the most widely sung hymns among Catholic and Protestant denominations alike. You may know it through Clarence A. Walworth's English translation as "Holy God, We Praise Thy Name" (LSB 940).

The text of the Te deum may be divided into a three-part structure. The first section takes the form of a hymn of praise to the Holy Trinity, describing the manner in which both the Church on earth and the Church in heaven offer praise to God. Part of this section is drawn from the words of the Sanctus ("Holy, Holy,") and recalls the praise of the heavenly host described in the book of Isaiah, and it closes with a doxology addressing all three persons of the Trinity. The second section assumes a more Christocentric and incarnational direction, taking the form of a hymn of praise to Christ, emphasizing his role as Redeemer and Judge. The final section is a prayer for assistance, guidance, and mercy from the Lord, and is based upon a series of phrases from Psalms 28, 145, 123, 33, and 31.

Stephen Starke's paraphrase of the Te Deum that we will sing together, "We Praise You and Acknowledge You, O God," is one of many in a long line of textual and musical adaptations of the Te Deum. The impetus for the writing of a new versification of the Te Deum was Rev. Starke's exposure to Gustav Holst's tune THAXTED while serving on an editorial committee for a Lutheran hymnal supplement. While Starke was already familiar with the melody in its original context within the "Jupiter" movement of Holst's orchestral suite The Planets, he had not previously encountered it as a hymn tune. Feeling that a tune as strong as THAXTED could "carry the weight" of a strong text, Starke settled on the Te Deum as the ideal text to adapt. Indeed, Starke would later remark that in this instance the tune was "the driving force inspiring the text."

Starke's paraphrase ends with the fourth stanza as given below, omitting the third section of the Te Deum from his paraphrase. He chose to omit the final section as it is believed by many scholars to not have been part of the earliest versions of the Te Deum and because he felt that stanza four ended strongly and "anything after that would diminish that strong conclusion."

You sit in splendid glory, enthroned at God's right hand,
Upholding earth and heaven by forces You command.
We know that You will come as our Judge that final day,
So help Your servants You have redeemed by blood, we pray;
May we with saints be numbered where praises never end,
In glory everlasting. Amen, O Lord, amen!

In singing the words of this hymn, may we be reminded of the joy that is ours through the redemptive work of Christ Jesus. May this and every song in which we join our voices shape and enliven our faith, and may we find that in singing them we are strengthened for the journey.








### Tulsa Saints Foundation

Blessings to all at the Christ the Redeemer Lutheran Church. It's been a minute since the last Tulsa Saints update. We have had an extremely busy summer providing for the growing homeless in the downtown Tulsa area. From a mission that started with 24 turkey sandwiches this last Friday evening the CTR ladies and Tulsa Saints teamed up and provided over 325 sandwiches to the homeless. Typically, we provide two sandwiches and an assortment of snacks and fruit along with coffee, various drinks, and bottles of water. The math puts us serving over 150 meals along with some extras for those who need it.



In addition to the food we provide clothes, many donated by CTR members, sleeping bags and tents when available. This last Friday we had several brothers and sisters come through the line who were homeless for the first time. We gave what we could. On our drive home, I asked Chuck, who was once homeless, what his first nights were like. He said, "Terrifying". I was taken aback, but rarely are any of us put into a position where we are terrified. Saddened, sometimes scared, but the word 'terrifying' rarely is something any of us have had the misfortune to experience. I praise Abba each day for the life he provides and try to glorify him in all I do. Though I fall short I know he has me even though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for you are with me; your rod and your staff, they comfort me. You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies, you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows. Psalm 23 4-5




Recently, we have tried to be more supportive in our homeless mission, besides the food and clothes we are trying to draw closer to our homeless brothers and sisters.

These last few weeks we have been putting out tables and chairs for people to sit and eat, read, mingle, and most importantly an opportunity to fellowship. Not all conversations bear fruit, but we hope with God's assistance we are able to spread Jesus's message of Love.

"Teacher, which is the great commandment in the Law?" And he said to him, "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind. This is the great and first commandment. And a second is like it: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. On these two commandments depend all the Law and the Prophets." Matthew 22: 36-40. As always, if you wish to come out and help we meet at Fridays 5:15 on 4th Street between Denver and Cheyenne in front of the Metro Bus Station (near the BOK). We hand out food and supplies until we run out.


### naQUILTS
