Outreach



The Lutheran World Relief (LWR) warehouses are located in St. Paul, MN and New Windsor, MD. LWR sends a truck through the midwest to collect donations of quilts and kits put together by congregations and delivers them to St. Paul where they are packaged and shipped all over the world.




Using Thrivent Action Funds and donations, the Tulsa Zone of Lutheran Women's Missionary League (LWML) rents a truck and loads it (at CTR) with donations from the Miami and Tulsa Zones of the LWML. This includes northeastern Oklahoma congregations from McAlester to Tahlequah to Adair and Bartlesville. The truck is driven the next day by volunteers and meets the LWR truck at Messiah Lutheran Church in Oklahoma City where donations are loaded and taken away to St. Paul.



An interesting part of packaging is the use of box labels enabling the donors to track where in the world the quilts and kits are shipped. CTR has done this so stay tuned to see where the help is sent!

Christ the Redeemer this year shipped 279 Quilts, 57 Hygiene kits, 305 School Kits and 43 Sewing Kits. We pray that these will bless those who receive them and show God's love and care for them. God has blessed us richly in order to help and serve His children.




MUSIC MINISTRY

CHOIR & HANDBELLS FOR YOUTH & ADULTS

During the past year, it has been my goal to broaden the repertoire of hymns that we sing together in worship here at Christ the Redeemer. To that end, I have selected a series of Hymns of the Season, similar in concept to the appointed Hymns of the Day that we sing each Sunday. It is my hope that, through the singing of each of these hymns repeatedly over the course of several weeks, these great hymns of the faith have begun to be ingrained more deeply in our communal memory.

This month, we will conclude our mini-series of Hymns of the Season that are hymns of praise and adoration. The Hymn of the Season for November is "Oh, That I Had a Thousand Voices" (LSB 811), one of the great chorales of the Lutheran tradition. Since its initial publication in Johann Anastasius Freylinghausen's highly influential "Spiritual Hymn Book" in 1704, this hymn has remained a fixture in Lutheran hymnals.

"Oh, That I Had a Thousand Voices" was written by Johann Mentzer (1658-1734), a Lutheran pastor who was heavily influenced by Pietism. Pietism arose within the Lutheran Church in the 17th-century and emphasized, among other things, the personal piety and private devotional lives of individual believers. The shift of theological and spiritual focus within many Lutheran church bodies that resulted following the rise of Pietism also heralded a change in the Lutheran chorale. Earlier chorales of the Reformation tended to use primarily objective language with a didactic thrust, highlighting the desire of Martin Luther and other early hymnists of the Lutheran Church that the Church's song should proclaim the truth of the Gospel and teach the Christian faith through the medium of music. By contrast, the hymnody of Pietism was often marked by far more subjective language and an emphasis on the personal Christian experience of the individual.

Despite Mentzer's Pietistic leanings, the theology of the first stanza of "Oh, That I Had a Thousand Voices" stems from a deeply orthodox Lutheran understanding of the Divine Service. In the Divine Service, the Lord serves His people through Word, Sacrament, and the forgiveness of sins, and His people respond with prayer, praise, thanksgiving, and song.

Oh, that I had a thousand voices To praise my God with thousand tongues!
My heart, which in the Lord rejoices, Would then proclaim in grateful songs
To all, wherever I might be, What great things God has done for me.

In the final stanza, we find a shift to an eschatological focus, pointing toward the day when Christ will come again in glory to judge both the living and the dead. In this stanza, we anticipate that day when, in the words of Saint Augustine, "all shall be Amen and Alleluia," and we shall join our voices in song around the throne of the Lamb in His kingdom which shall not end.

Creator, humbly I implore You To listen to my earthly song
Until that day when I adore You, Together with the angel throng
And learn with choirs of heaven to sing Eternal anthems to my King!

Alleluia! Amen.



STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT FUND




