This month, we return to the subject of Hymns of the Season. While I have not made the Hymns of the Season the focus of my newsletter articles since November 2022, we have continued the practice of singing selected hymns repeatedly over a number of weeks in order to ingrain those great hymns of the faith more deeply in our communal memory.

During Eastertide, our Hymn of the Season will be, "Scatter the Darkness, Break the Gloom" (LSB 481). This hymn, inspired by the buoyant and dancelike eighteenth century French carol BESANÇON, was written by Lutheran pastor and hymnist Stephen Starke (b. 1955) in 1995. Starke's original unpublished text consisted of four stanzas; however, the version of the hymn found in LSB matches the three stanza version first published in Starke's 2005 hymn collection *O Sing of Christ*.

The opening stanza evokes the first Easter dawn, the rising of the sun revealing the empty tomb that was unable to contain the risen Christ. In the image of that empty tomb, we, along with the first witnesses to the resurrection, are assured that death has been defeated. The victory over sin and death won for the by the innocent death and glorious resurrection of Christ is proclaimed exuberantly in the second and third stanzas. In the second stanza, Starke references the Agnus Dei, a Christian symbol of the resurrection, which depicts a lamb, that is, the very Lamb of God who takes away the sin of the world, carrying a victory banner. In the final stanza, trumpets sound forth the victory song. We in turn join our voices in that song, confident that, in Christ, death does not have the final word. We sing in the knowledge that our risen Lord brings life from death and that since He is risen, we too shall rise. Alleluia! Amen.

- Rebates are offered to individual campers who are actively participating (attending worship, Bible study &/or confirmation, youth activities, etc.) at Christ the Redeemer Lutheran Church.

Greetings from St. Louis Seminary!

Thank you for all your prayers and support! We certainly couldn't make it through Seminary without your help. Seminary has been quite a journey with all kinds of twists and turns. By the time you read this we may know where we are going, but in the meantime we only know that we are leaving. How does it feel? Kind of like the end of a trip to who knows where. 

Eden Village, a program of The Gathering Tree is a 501(c)(3) that has created a proven concept by building relationships and tiny home communities for homeless individuals who have a disability. By bringing an Eden Village to Tulsa, we'd be providing access to dignified housing, providing support services, inserting individuals into an active community and show our chronically disabled homeless population that they do matter, and we do care for our own.

The first Eden Village was created in Springfield, MO. Due to its success, the inspiration to create a long-term solution to chronic homelessness has spread across the nation. Eden Village of Tulsa is basing its structure on the original village, with 50 homes, a community center, landscaped park area and garden. Our management team is being trained and mentored alongside the team in Springfield, MO and other Eden Village communities, across the country, to ensure success here in Tulsa.

This model is unique in many ways. Springfield tested the concept, and along with helping other cities start their own communities, they are currently developing their third in a town much smaller than Tulsa. With demonstrated success, we can build more over the next few years, until no one in Tulsa sleeps outside.
