## A Letter From The Pastor

Fellow Redeemed.

Pentecost is the longest single season on the church calendar; it lasts almost six months. It is the time when the church celebrates the gift of, and work of, the Holy Spirit. What God is doing through His Holy Spirit will not be understood by our sinful minds, naturally. Instead, it is absolutely necessary that God opens the minds of believers, so that they can fully know and understand the work that the Holy Spirit is doing. What is most interesting is that the Work of the Holy Spirit will seem small, and insignificant to the world. A simple faith that just accepts God's Word at its surface reading is often not enough for the world. The world always wants gigantic, over the top results; the kind we often see in sports and climactic events like concerts, or dramas. Unfortunately, the true power of the Holy Spirit works in much smaller, but far more powerful ways; like when someone says, "I believe".

The power of a small simple faith can be overstated. 1 Kings 19:11-13, we find Elijah running for his life. God comes to him through a word. There was then a powerful wind, that tore the mountain apart and shattered rocks, but the Lord was not in the wind. Then came an earthquake, but God was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire, but God was not in the fire. Then came a gentle whisper, God was in the whisper. Don't miss the whisper of God in your life as we travel with God through Pentecost. The whisper of God IS the Word and Sacraments. In a world that is so noisy and loud, it is so easy to miss this simple little whisper of God. God is with us. God is in control, and God is speaking. You will hear Him in the whisper of His Word and find Him in the Sacraments.

## THE WORLD MAKES TULSA BETTER

Each June 20, the globe comes together to honor World Refugee Day. This event, launched in 2000, brings together the worldwide community to focus on ways to improve the lives of refugees. Most of us

know that refugees are forced to leave their homes due to war, terror or other crises- but fleeing their home country is often just the beginning of a difficult journey.

Currently, 87 refugees have arrived in Tulsa this year alone from places such as Afghanistan, Iran, Kazakhstan, Myanmar, Venezuela, Syria, Honduras, and Bolivia. Many of them are initially being settled in apartments near 71st & Riverside just down the street from CTR.

CTR Outreach & Youth Ministries are partnering with Catholic Charities of Eastern Oklahoma to host a Refugee Day Event for those who have been placed in Tulsa. This event will be at Christ the Redeemer on Friday, June 16 from 6:30-8:30 PM in Fellowship East and the front lawn/patio.

Food will be catered through The Kitchen at The Market of Catholic Charities. CTR Outreach will be preparing desserts. CTR Youth and Outreach members will be serving as volunteers at the event.

What brings warmth and shelter to families by becoming a bed, room divider, backpack, and at times even a home???


#### **HOW CAN YOU HELP??**



#### Carson's Cowboys will be walking for Cystic Fibrosis in Stillwater on August 26, 2023

Cystic Fibrosis is a life-threatening disease that comes from a genetic mutation primarily affecting the lungs and digestive system. Estimates show about 12 million American's are currently CF carriers. CF affects more than 30,000 kids and young adults, but it isn't just a childhood disease. It also affects adults. In the US, about 1 of every 3,600 Caucasian children is born with CF, compared to 1 of every 17,000 African Americans and only 1 of every 90,000 Asian Americans. Cystic Fibrosis can also be carried in people who don't develop the disease if they inherit only 1 cf gene. The carrier parent can then pass on the disease to his or her child. With All My Heart

Great Strides is the Cystic Fibrosis Foundations largest national fundraising event. Each year, more than 125,000 people participate in hundreds of walks across the country to raise funds for cystic fibrosis research and drug development.

Great Strides continues to gain momentum, as do our research efforts and the progress we've made in the search for a cure. The CF Foundation has raised and invested hundreds of millions of dollars to support the development of new CF drugs and therapies. But the lives of people with this disease are still cut far too short. We need the public's continued support to fulfill our mission of finding a cure and improving the quality of life of those with the disease.

## Seminary News



Members of Christ the Redeemer:

Greetings for the last time from Seminary! It was announced at the vicarage placement service that we will be moving to Okeechobee, FL. I have one week of classes left and then on the 26th of May a truck will be coming to pick up our stuff and cart it off to Florida.

We did hope to come back to Oklahoma, but that was not God's plan. We will miss Oklahoma and our Tulsa friends. You have been a tremendous help to us in encouragement and support. We could not have done it without you. Although this next year is a vicarage and I am still a student, if it works out and the congregation and I agree, I will continue with a Call and Ordination.

The name of our vicarage congregation is Peace Lutheran Church in Okeechobee, FL. To find us on a map look for the big lake in south central Florida. We are on the north end of the lake. There are about 5,000 in the city of Okeechobee. During the winter the population about doubles with visitors attempting to escape the cold northern winters. The average high temperature in winter is 74 and the low is 51 degrees. The average summer high temperature is 90 and the average low is 72 degrees. Having previously lived in Florida for 15 years we are aware that it gets humid for about 7 months, but I never had to shovel heat or humidity!

The congregation has about 50 worshipping weekly during the summer months. That number probably doubles during the winter months. Preschool is their main ministry besides Word and Sacrament. Previously, the congregation was served by the same pastor for 30 years. He decided to retire three years ago, and the congregation has been vacant since. Peace is the only LCMS Lutheran church in the county, and many surrounding counties have no LCMS church. My supervisor will be about 45 minutes away.

Okeechobee is the county seat and the only city in the county. Like most of central Florida, the region is agricultural in nature. Dairy farming, cattle ranching, and citrus are most of the agricultural industry. As you can well imagine, the lake provides great fishing. There are many tournaments around the lake throughout the year. There are plenty of nature trails for bikers and hikers. If we want to go to a beach, we can get to the Atlantic in about 1 hour. The Gulf of Mexico beaches are about 2.5 hours away. Key West is 5 hours south. Orlando is about an hour and a half north.

Deb and I are renting a house across the street from the church. Our new address is: 788 NW 22nd Lane, Okeechobee, FL 34972. We will be arriving there about June 15th and my Installation will be on June 25th. We are at the same time sad to be ending an era of Seminary study, and our time in Oklahoma. Hopefully we can return some time soon.

Thank you and may God continue to richly bless Christ the Redeemer, Tulsa.



Helping Hands for Lutheran Deaf OutreachLutheran Deaf Outreach -- \$50,000

Lutheran Deaf Outreach, an RSO of the LCMS, has a passion for teaching others to share Jesus with deaf people. Over 98 percent of deaf and hard-of-hearing individuals do not know Jesus or attend a Christian church. Lutheran Deaf Outreach is equipping both deaf and hearing people with Gospel materials so the saving message of Jesus can be shared with the deaf community.

Mozambique Dorcas Sewing ProjectOklahoma District LWML Grant -- \$5000

In addition to proclaiming the Gospel of Christ, Igreja Crista da Concordia em Mozambique – ICCM (the Lutheran Church in Mozambique) supports the women's Dorcus Sewing Project in providing expansion to other groups and members. The connectivity with sewing lessons provides additional opportunity for spiritual connection so the Gospel can be shared while teaching the art of garment making giving them hope for a better future and a way out of poverty. This is part of the funds needed to expand this ministry.

Rev. Joel P. Fritsche (one of the four missionaries supported by CTR) has accepted a call to serve as director of Vicarage and Deaconess Internships and assistant professor of Exegetical Theology at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis beginning July 1. He will be formally installed Aug. 25 during the Opening Service of the 2023-24 academic year.

For more than two decades, Fritsche has served The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) as a pastor, church planter, missionary and theological educator in the United States and in the Dominican Republic. He will succeed <u>Dr. Glenn Nielsen</u> who will conclude 33 years of service as director of Vicarage and Deaconess Internships at the end of the 2022-23 academic year.



"As Dr. Nielsen retires from his many years of excellent service overseeing vicarages and deaconess internships, Rev. Fritsche is the ideal person to carry on directing this vital piece of our students' formation for ministry," said Seminary President Dr. Thomas J. Egger. 
