- 2. Christian Education Sundays and Wednesdays are alive with God's Word. The Word of God is being taught and learned, and is being applied by the faithful members of CTR. Sunday School openings are high energy and the kids love the dancing and singing. Many have told me that it's almost like a mini VBS every Sunday. Both of our DCEs provide the highest level of instruction for all ages, as well as utilizing the latest innovations for learning. If you have not attended one of CTR's many instruction opportunities lately, please make plans to attend. Many congregations in the LCMS would have to stop here. We have many lay-led studies as well. Ladies meet every Friday around God's Word, the OWLS have guest speakers come in monthly to give real world information. We even have a ROMEO group that goes out to lunch periodically. ROMEO stands for Retired Old Men Eating Out. I know that they share God's Word with each other, not to mention the wonderful fellowship that they enjoy. Wednesday nights at CTR are buzzing with activity as we share a meal, provide confirmation instruction, as well as instruction for children, men's group, women's group, and the young adults (age 20-30) meet around God's Word.
- 3. Music Ministry We have an amazing Music Ministry here at CTR. Jacob utilizes hymnody and music that is fresh and new. He regularly chooses preludes, postludes, choral pieces, voluntaries, etc. that were written by some of the most amazing hymn writers of our time. I am overjoyed when I see selections by contemporary composers like Behnke, Cherwien, Hobby, Burkhardt, Callahan and Ferguson, just to name a few. What an absolute blessing it is to have these pieces and their composers represented in our worship life. At CTR we have a very active choir, bell choir, and children's choir. Our children are learning the liturgical arts on Sunday mornings. The music at CTR is of the highest caliber and quality.
- 4. Youth CTR has a vibrant, active and faith focused Youth Program. The young people who are active in it are very connected and have made what will become lifelong friendships. Each of our Youth love Jesus and love God's Word. They are connected to our church in ways that other congregations within the LCMS would envy. They have an amazing hunger for God's Word and they desire to grow in faith, service and love, just as our vision statement says. We can all be very proud of each and every one of these young people. In a world that is trying to pull them in hundreds of different directions, they choose to come to CTR. That is a blessing.
- 5. Family and Children's Our family and children's ministry is constantly providing Christ-centered activities for our youngest members and their parents. From worship bags to overnight stays at Camp Lutherhoma, to day trips and pizza parties, movie nights, and the granddaddy of them all: the Fall Festival. The list of activities that are provided through Family and Children's Ministry is too long to be able to mention them all. Most congregations in the LCMS have a youth program, and that's it. God is the vehicle, and He is responsible for all of these ministries that are happening here at CTR. This month, we return to our discussion of the Hymns of the Season. It is my hope that, through the singing of select hymns repeatedly over the course of several weeks, these great songs of the faith have been more deeply ingrained in the worship life of this congregation. Hopefully, the information I have shared in these articles regarding the origins of the texts and melodies that we sing together has deepened your appreciation for the rich treasury of theology, poetry, and music that is the Church's hymnody. In addition, perhaps the inclusion of these hymns in worship, some of which are more familiar than others, has led you to discover new favorite hymns!

The Hymn of the Season beginning on the Day of Pentecost, May 28, will be "O Day Full of Grace" (LSB 503). The earliest extant version of this hymn is found in a fifteenth-century manuscript from the Vadstena Abbey in Sweden. "O Day Full of Grace" was translated into Danish by Hans Thomissøn, one of the leading Danish Lutheran hymnists and theologians of the sixteenth century, for inclusion in The Danish Hymnal of 1569. In addition to translating the text from Swedish into Danish, Thomissøn altered the language of the hymn to better reflect Lutheran teaching. It is this Lutheranized Danish version of the hymn, rather than the fifteenth-century Swedish text, that Gerald Thorson (1921-2001) translated into English. Thorson's translation was first published in Lutheran Book of Worship (1978) and is the translation that appears in Lutheran Service Book.

While "O Day Full of Grace" is most often associated with the feast of Pentecost, the hymn actually outlines the shape of the whole of the church year in only five stanzas. The first stanza recalls the Benedictus (Luke 1:68-79), a hymn often associated with the season of Advent, which reminds us that Christ came to bring light to those dwelling in the shadows of a sin-darkened world. The second and third stanzas point to the seasons of Christmas, Epiphany, Lent, and Easter as we sing of the Incarnation, death, and resurrection of our Lord. We sing of how God, in infinite grace and mercy, came to us in flesh and blood in the person of Jesus, living, suffering, dying, and rising, that we might one day rise with Him, raising our "voices in endless singing." The fourth stanza points to the events of the Day of Pentecost and the new life given to the Church by the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. In the fifth stanza, the hymn-writer looks toward that last day when God will restore all of creation to Himself, anticipating the day when God's people will "gather in song...hearts aglow" before the throne of the Lamb in His kingdom. And so we sing together in this place for a time, awaiting with hope that day when we will join our voices in a song that will not end.

Elders Recommendation on Flags Placement At the request of the Board of Directors

The Elders discussed the placement of the American flag and the Christian flag. Previously, both flags were displayed in the Sanctuary. During the recent Sanctuary remodeling, the flags were removed from the Sanctuary and placed in the west Fellowship Hall.

The Elders were asked to recommend a location for future display. After reviewing several published articles and other sources of information, the Elders voted to recommend the flags continue to be displayed in the Fellowship Hall and not returned to the Sanctuary. It should be noted that there is no Synodical requirement or specific advice for flag placement, and the LCMS has always held that the display of the American and Christian flags is an adiaphoron. It is left to the discretion of the individual congregations.

Our recommendation was influenced by an article from the Lutheran Witness published in 2017. That article referenced a section from the 1996 Altar Guild Manual which stated that "Many Lutheran churches display flags in the chancel or nave, but this practice must be discouraged. The national flag is a symbol of the state whose value and purposes are different from, and sometimes incompatible with, those of the church. The 'Christian flag' is a piece of redundant and distracting symbolism since the focus in the church is on the altar and cross in the chancel."








acolyte Training
