Volunteers continue producing Braille books of the Bible for shipment worldwide. Presently, Ministry Center #73 is assigned production of Luke in Swahili and Leviticus in English and produces over 125 books a month here at Christ the Redeemer. The pending sale of Our Savior necessitated a move after 35 years and CTR extended an invitation to become a part of their family.

Following a meeting in June 2022 at CTR, the physical moving of equipment and supplies began in July.Never missing a beat, production continued with the press being moved as the last group at Our Savior finished their regular workday.

September began a new chapter for Ministry Center #73 – adjusting time schedules a bit, settling in, finding the correct entrance, etc., but the essentials remain the same... committed, faithful, hardworking, generous, fun loving, sharing, caring, loving volunteers who continue to desire to share the Gospel of Our Lord and Savior Jesus with the blind and visually impaired worldwide.

Six dedicated volunteer groups (Bartlesville Redeemer, Our Savior Tulsa, Immanuel Broken Arrow, Claremore Redeemer, and 2 groups from Christ the Redeemer Tulsa) meet monthly to perform the necessary tasks to prepare the books for shipment. Some of these groups include members of sister congregations, Grace, Trinity and King of Kings Glenpool.

As coordinators of Ministry Center #73 we are deeply indebted to these volunteers, some in their 80's and 90's who faithfully show up graciously doing whatever is needed.

Pastor Hobson,

Greetings from Immanuel Lutheran Church and School in St. Charles, Missouri. Last July, our area received 13 inches of rain in under an hour. The flooding results were apparent: cars abandoned on the interstate, people trapped from going home, and the banks of waterways cresting. One area that was hit particularly hard was the Copperfield Subdivision. I knew we had three members who lived there. We agreed to fix their homes through the Lutheran Early Response Team (LERT). That soon turned into 64 homes in this one subdivision that needed help.

Kris Schuldt and I started recruiting people to come and help. We did not know when or where they would come from. However, your team called us all the way from Oklahoma! Wow! What a witness to come all the way here and do the work! It pushed us to the end of where we needed to be and would probably still need to finish more houses.

Christ tells us, "You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill can not be hidden. Nor do people light a lamp and put it under a basket, they put it on a stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father who is in heaven."

While we know that we do not do this work to be seen. People do see the work that is done. It is an incredibly humbling experience to be on this side and to see all the help we did get. One man told us while we were fixing his house, "I know you guys are from the church because you are out here helping us when no one else would." What a witness.

I have included hats for you, Pastor, and your other pastor, plus the team. I thank you for sending these men and women out. I have lifelong memories I will never forget. Thank you.

The letter is addressed to the Pastor of Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran Church in Skiatook where our LERT Team leader Denny Rader is a member. Two members of Trinity Lutheran Church-Broken Arrow Jeff Andrews and Paul Steitz as well as Brad Young of Christ Redeemer made up the rest of the team.

Our 4 man LERT team deployed to St Charles and O'Fallon Missouri in early February to help repair flood damaged basements of 64 homes. All materials of sheetrock, wood studs, sheetrock mud and tape and other supplies were purchased with donations and grants and all donated labor SO that no homeowner had to pay for these renovations. This was a critical

factor due to the unusual nature of why the flood occurred. Very few of the homes were insured for this kind of disaster and had no means or resources to take on this task.

During the 7 month deployment teams volunteered from as far away as Florida, New Jersey, Wisconsin and California and all points in between and traveled at their own expense to participate. Many LCMS homeowners in that region volunteered to provide room and frequently meals for the teams that came to be a part of this effort.

It was gratifying and heart warming to listen to the various homeowners describe the terror of waking up in the middle of the night to find their basements rapidly filling up with flood waters and then being faced with an overwhelming disaster and no idea how to go about recovering from this.

Then imagine 64 homeowners getting a knock on the door and a LERT volunteer telling them that they were here to help them recover from this disaster at no cost to the homeowners. Not only that but also that volunteers were coming from all over the United States to help with the recovery efforts on their behalf. What a gospel message!






Lone Ranger Christians? By Rev. Tiews on 25/06/23

As this month concludes, I am once again in Latvia, attending Luther Academy's Intensive Study Weeks. It is a blessing to interact with our students on a person-toperson basis after five months of seeing them every week only over Zoom. But it is also wonderful to fellowship with my fellow LCMS missionaries / Luther Academy instructors who in some way serve as my "Winkel," the term pastors use for their brother pastors in the local circuit whom they meet on a monthly basis. Believers in the triune God—both in the Old and New Testament—have always been called to live with one another in community. For us today, this means to regularly gather to receive Word and Sacrament, but also to fellowship with one another outside of the worship service (hopefully, as you are able, for Bible study, prayer groups, retreats, etc.). Christians are not "Lone Rangers," keeping their faith to themselves in isolation. 40th Biennial Convention in Milwaukee, Wisconsin

The Lutheran Women's Missionary League, also known as Lutheran Women in Mission, welcomed over 3,500 people to their 40th biennial convention in Milwaukee, Wisconsin, June 22–25, 2023, under the theme "Celebrate the Lord of the Nations." The convention theme was based on Psalm 33:12–13.

2023–2025 Mission Goal and Mission Grants


