A Letter From The Pastor

Fellow Redeemed.

Faith Alone is the cornerstone of all that we believe as Lutherans. As we approach Reformation Sunday in October, it is important to remember this key doctrine from Scripture, that we are saved by God's Grace through faith in Jesus Christ.

This article will seek to delve into the fundamental doctrine that emerged during the Reformation. This cornerstone belief, championed by Martin Luther, transformed the religious landscape and continues to shape our understanding of salvation today.

Faith Alone, or "Sola Fide" in Latin, emphasizes that our salvation comes through faith in Jesus Christ alone. It stands in stark contrast to the prevailing view of the time, which required

believers to rely on their own works and good deeds for salvation. Luther, compelled by his deep study of scripture, boldly proclaimed that faith, not human actions, is the means by which we are justified before God.

recognition that salvation is a gift from God, freely given to us through His grace. We are unable to earn or merit this gift through our own efforts. Rather, it is through faith that we receive God's saving grace. As the Apostle Paul beautifully articulates in his letter to the Ephesians, "For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith - and this is not from yourselves, it is the gift of God" (Ephesians 2:8).

This doctrine of Faith Alone reminds us that our salvation does not depend on our own righteousness or achievements. It liberates us from a burdened conscience, offering assurance that our relationship with God is not contingent upon our flawed human nature. Instead, it redirects our focus to Jesus Christ, the author and perfecter of our faith (Hebrews 12:2).

Faith Alone also encourages a personal and vibrant, and what our mission statement calls a living relationship with Jesus Christ. Faith Alone invites us to trust in His promises, to seek Him diligently, and to live out our faith in all aspects of our lives, only by the power of the Holy Spirit. By placing our trust in God's mercy and grace, we are freed to love and serve our neighbors, confident that our salvation is secure in Christ.

As Lutherans, we continue to hold fast to the doctrine of Faith Alone. It is a precious gift that reminds us of the unmerited grace bestowed upon us by God, and the centrality of faith in our spiritual journey. Let us embrace this truth, allowing it to shape our lives, and inspiring us to share the good news of God's love and redemption with others.


May our faith be strengthened, our hearts be filled with gratitude, and our lives be a testament to the transforming power of God's grace through faith alone. Amen.



The October OWLS meeting is planned for Thursday, October 26th at 1:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall EAST at CTR. The speakers will be Ryan Allen and Caelyn Musgrove, Executive Team & Storytelling members from the new, yet-to-open Oklahoma Museum of Popular Culture, also known as "OKPOP". Refreshments and dessert will be served.

Located in downtown Tulsa across from Cain's Ballroom, OKPOP is a division of the 130-year-old Oklahoma Historical Society. The museum will be telling the stories from Oklahoma Creatives and is currently in their curatorial and exhibit development phase. The mission of OKPOP is to inspire and empower new generations of artists, musicians, and storytellers to impact the world through the powerful force of creative expression by showcasing the legacy of Oklahomans and their influence on popular culture. The Storytelling team will be presenting OKPOP's mission and storytelling approach to the planned OKPOP Experience.





This month, we return to our discussion of the Hymns of the Season. Hopefully, the information I share in these articles regarding the origins of the texts and melodies we sing together deepens your appreciation for the rich treasury of theology, poetry, and music that is the Church's hymnody.

The Hymn of the Season for October is "New Songs of Celebration Render" (LSB 792). This hymn is a paraphrase of Psalm 98 by English theologian and hymnologist Erik Routley (1917-1982). Reformed (that is, Calvinist) church bodies have a long tradition of adapting the Psalms into metrical paraphrases in the vernacular, a tradition the Congregationalist Routley follows in this hymn. "New Songs of Celebration Render" was first included in Cantate Domino, an ecumenical hymnal published in 1974.

Psalm 98 is divided into three parts: verses 1-3, 4-6, and 7-9. Routley's three-stanza hymnic version mimics the tripartite structure of the Psalm. The opening lines of the first stanza recall Psalm 98:1: "O sing to the Lord a new song, for he has done marvelous things!"

The second stanza, which calls upon the earth and all things in it to "peal out the praise of grace abounding," echoes the Psalmist's call for all the earth to "make a joyful noise to the Lord." In Routley's paraphrase, voices, instruments, and "all things that live in earth and ocean" unite in praise, causing the very heavens to ring.

The third stanza reflects the words of the Psalmist in verses 7-9: "Let the sea roar, and all that fills it…let the rivers clap their hands; let the hills sing for joy together." Routley, joining with the Psalmist, calls upon all creation to join the unending song of praise to the Creator. He addresses the rivers, seas, mountains, and stones, adjuring them to "find a voice to praise His name."

The rich imagery of this hymn beautifully captures the ecstatic joy of the Psalm, thereby "putting the psalms into our mouths and hearts," in the words of Lutheran composer Rev. Henry Gerike (b. 1948). As we sing this hymn together, may we do it always to the glory of the One who, in the Incarnation of His beloved Son, "has revealed to every nation His everlasting righteousness." Alleluia! Amen.



October 2023 Eden Village News for our Friends and Supporters

Tulsa County Awards Eden Village a \$500K Grant!

We're very excited to announce that last month the Tulsa County Commissioners voted unanimously to award Eden Village of Tulsa a \$500,000 grant to help build the infrastructure at Eden Village. This work has started, so now we'll have the funding to complete things like water lines, sewer lines, parking lot, and road. We're very grateful for this support from Tulsa County, led by Commissioners Karen Keith, Kelly Dunkerly, and Stan Sallee

There's exciting progress being made and here are the current developments:

- Empire Fence has completed installing chain link or wood fencing around the entire property.
- . Our first 4 homes are here in Tulsa as model homes and will be delivered out to our land this month. Our next 5 homes are completed in Neosho and hopefully will be delivered to Tulsa this winter to be set up on their permanent foundations, completing our first group of 9 homes.
- We have 3 churches on board as sponsors and are close to having other churches on our team as home sponsors, giving us a total of 10 sponsored.
- Owen Plumbing has started installing water lines, and competing plans for the city sewer lines.
- We are about 35% done with filling the "pond" on the south part of our property with dirt.
- · Our official ground-breaking has been set for Oct. 27th at 9:00!

All young adults are invited to join in Bible study on Sunday mornings @ 9:40 am in the Fishbowl led by DCE Nikki, where we are using the Wired Word.





SUMMER YOUTH SERVICE TRIP

July 5-13, 2024 | Open to students ages 13-20 years old

We will be serving teaming up with Immanuel-Broken Arrow at an inner-city immersion program through Prince of Peace in Cincinnati, OH. At the end of the week we will have the opportunity to also visit the Creation Museum and Ark Encounter. In addition, during the week one evening we will attend an MLB ballgame of the Reds vs. Rockies (and eat dinner there). The expected cost is currently \$225.

The goal of this immersion program is to give a group of volunteers an indepth experience of the inner city environment in which Prince of Peace

Lutheran Church exists within Cincinnati. Prince of Peace is in the Over-the-Rhine neighborhood, an inner-city environment. The immersion program is intended for an extended period of time. We will sleep at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, participate in ministry activities that occur at Prince of Peace, many of which serves the homeless and poor in Over-the-Rhine. These include "The Bridge" a day shelter program on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday from 11am-2pm and their Wednesday night community program of a devotion and community meal starting at 6pm as well as Kids Church for inner city youth on Sundays at 11:30 am.

Finally, the immersion program will give us exposure to other agencies and environments outside of Prince of Peace that serve the homeless and inner city youth in Over-the-Rhine. This includes the Freestore Foodbank and Wesley Chapel Mission Center youth outreach. We will need commitments by those planning to attend, no later than December 1.
