

Twenty CTR volunteers worked on Tuesday, August 15, assembling 322 school backpacks. Each backpack contained 4 spiral notebooks, a 12 inch ruler, scissors, 5 pens, 5 pencils, eraser, pencil sharpener and a 24 box crayons. Each of the 98

personal health care kits were wrapped in a bath size towel containing 2 soap bars, comb, toothbrush and nail clipper. Each of the 28 sewing packs contained two 3 yard fabric cuts along with two matching spools of thread.

All these boxed items, along with over 225 quilts, will be loaded on a truck Monday, October 2, and driven to Messiah Lutheran Church in OKC, on Tuesday, October 3.

Five Thrivent Action Team cards were used along with all the items donated by our members.










What brings warmth and shelter to families by becoming a bed, room divider, backpack, and at times even a home???





This month, we return to our discussion of the Hymns of the Season. I hope that the singing of these hymns has more deeply ingrained the great songs of the faith in the worship life of this congregation. Hopefully, the information I share in these articles regarding the origins of the texts and melodies we sing together deepens your appreciation for the rich treasury of theology, poetry, and music that is the Church's hymnody.

The Hymn of the Season for September, "O God of Light" (LSB 836), is one that I suspect will be new to many of you! This hymn, first published in 1952, was written by Sarah E. Taylor (1883-1954), an American college professor. Taylor wrote the text in response to an invitation from the Hymn Society of America to poets and hymn writers to compose new texts in celebration of the publication of the Revised Standard Version of the Bible. The Hymn Society selected Taylor's hymn from more than 550 submissions to be sung during services of dedication for the new translation of Scripture. On September 30, 1952, more than two million people across the country sang this hymn for the first time at dedication services for the RSV.

"O God of Light" was first published in a Lutheran hymnal in 1958 and was subsequently included in later American Eutheran Hymnals such as Lutheran Book of Worship (1978), Evangelical Lutheran Worship (2006), and Lutheran Service Book (2006). The version of the text found in LSB differs from Taylor's original and follows the altered version first included in LBW. H. Barrie Cabena wrote the striking hymn tune, ATKINSON, specifically for inclusion in Lutheran Book of Worship.

The opening line of the hymn, from which the title is drawn, is a paraphrase of Psalm 119:105: "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." This stanza reminds us that the Word of God reveals to us the grace and love of God for us, His children. We live in the light of God's Word as we await the coming of Christ.

In the second stanza, Taylor reminds us that "though we rebelled" by our self-centered thoughts, words, and deeds, God remains faithful, seeking us out as a Shepherd after lost sheep in order to bring us to Himself.

The third stanza is a celebration of the truth that, through Holy Scripture, God is still speaking to His people. Despite the passage of time and the hardening of hearts, God's Word continually reveals to us the compassionate face of the Savior, who offers healing, mercy, and grace to all.

The final stanza reflects on God's summons to all the people of the world, regardless of class or race, to join in the feast of salvation, singing songs of praise before the throne of the Lamb. In singing the words of this stanza, we look forward to that day when we, with all the faithful, will blend our voices in "one great anthem" with believers of all times and places.

In these days of pilgrimage, may we sing together in eager anticipation of that great day when God will heal His creation, making all things new and restoring all things to Himself. To God alone be the glory!



LERT TEAMS DEPLOYMENT

On June 18, 2023, just after midnight, a strong derecho swept through Green Country with around 100 mph winds. Three confirmed tornadoes also touched down in northeastern Oklahoma during that time. Around 200,000 people lost power and four days later nearly 70,000 were still without power. Nineteen (19) counties had been impacted by the storm.

LERT Operations were staged out of Trinity Lutheran Church in Broken Arrow. The church provided lodging for team members from out of town and out of state in its three-bedroom house with kitchen. Two daily meals were also provided during deployment. The LCMS provided cots and foam mattresses for the volunteers staying in the house.



Operations were managed by Denny Rader, Miami Circuit Disaster Relief Assistant Manager from the LCMS Oklahoma District and Shepherd of the Hills Lutheran church disaster ministry. Two LCMS districts were represented from Oklahoma and Texas. Five LCMS churches from Broken Arrow, Skiatook, Tulsa and Tyler, Texas assisted in disaster response operations. A total of fifty-four (54) volunteers put in six hundred and twenty-eight (628) hours of work in a physically demanding environment with a high heat index during deployment time. The team's 4-WD tractor and grapple was utilized frequently as well as the tracked grapple apparatus that the Texas team brought with them.

Thirty-one (31) homeowners and one church (CTR) were helped during operations. Trinity Lutheran Church provided hand quilted blankets and gift cards to give to homeowners after finishing a job. We found this to be a special way to introduce the Gospel and leave with them a reminder of God's love and mercy displayed by our team. Snacks, water, electrolytes, and sack lunches were prepared before departure to work sites in coolers. Fellowship and Spiritual Care Devotions and prayers were conducted every morning before departure to work sites.

At worksites, we had initial meetings to discuss the homeowners' needs both spiritual as well as cleanup of debris. We invited the Comfort Dog ministry with PERSIS and her teams to walk alongside the LERT team. Steven Hurry quotes: "Having PERSIS and her team available to bring comfort to the homeowners is a blessing. It also helped to keep engaged with the property owners while the LERT team did their work. The homeowners were worried about their property and the safety of the LERT workers. The Comfort Dog team was there to assure the homeowners that the LERT teams are professional, and volunteers well trained to complete their task. We felt that the Comfort Dog team allowed the LERT team to complete their tasks without using their resources for the homeowners."

The team plans to conduct another round of operations in early fall after temperatures have improved to do any work that wasn't able to be done. Feel free to contact us if you know of someone in need of assistance. A LERT account has been established at CTR if anyone wants to donate funds to help fund our future operations and additional equipment needs.






