

As we enter the season of Advent, we return to our discussion of the Hymns of the Season. Hopefully, the information I share in these articles regarding the origins of the texts and melodies we sing together deepens your appreciation for the rich treasury of theology, poetry, and music that is the Church's hymnody.

The Hymn of the Season for Advent is "Hark! A Thrilling Voice is Sounding" (LSB 345). In the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, this hymn is the appointed Hymn of the Day for the Third Sunday in Advent. While the origins of the original Latin hymn text are unknown, it likely originated between 800 and 1100 AD. The translation of "Hark! A Thrilling Voice" found in Lutheran Service Book is by Edward Caswall (1814-1878), an Anglican priest who is widely regarded to be one of the finest translators of Latin hymns into English.

"Hark," the rather archaic word that begins this venerable Advent hymn, is an alert, a call to listen or pay attention. Throughout our lives, there are many voices, both internal and external, that call for our attention. However, the writer of this hymn seeks to draw our attention to a very particular voice. In the first chapter of the Gospel according to John the Evangelist, John the Baptist said, "I am the voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Make straight the way for the Lord' (John 1:23). The importance of this declaration lies not in who John the Baptist was; rather, it is important because of the coming of the One for whom John was sent to prepare the way.

In preparation for the coming of Christ, the writer of the hymn calls us to "Cast aside the works of darkness, all you children of the day!" This admonition draws heavily from the language of Paul's letter to the Ephesians, "For you were once darkness, but now you are light in the Lord. Live as children of the light" (Ephesians 5:8). We do not always act as if we are children of the light. All too often, we do the wrong thing, and we fail to do the good that God would have us do. In spite of this, the third stanza of this hymn reminds us that "the Lamb, so long expected, comes with pardon down from heaven." In the light of this marvelous gift of pardon and forgiveness, we are able to move through the season of Advent with deep, expectant joy. We hear Christ's promise, "Surely I am coming soon," and respond, "Amen. Come, Lord Jesus!" (Revelation 22:20).

Hull Family Vicarage Newsletter

Greetings from sunny Okeechobee Florida! It has been a while since we sent out a newsletter. Life has been hectic, though. I am on a deferred Vicarage, which means I have completed 3 years of academic work and am in a Vicarage that hopefully will convert to a Call when the Vicarage is over this May.

After classes wrapped up in late May, my wife Debra and I headed for my assigned congregation in Florida. We stopped and spent a few days in St. Petersburg to celebrate Deb's birthday and await the truck that was carrying all our belongings. It was good to get to the beach and relax a bit. We arrived in Okeechobee a couple of weeks before I was to be installed so that we could get the house set up along with Deb's home office. The Oklahoma Center for Nonprofits has continued their arrangement with Deb so that she can work remotely from Florida. This is truly a blessing for us and we are grateful to God that her Executive Director is gracious in continuing this arrangement.

For those that may be wondering, we are at Peace Lutheran Church and School in Okeechobee, FL. To find Okeechobee on the map simply find the big lake in the southern part of the Florida peninsula. That lake is Lake Okeechobee, and the city of Okeechobee is located on the northern end of the lake. The lake is so big that it took us 2.5 hours to drive around it. It is known for the amazing Large Mouth Bass fishing, gator hunting, and frog gigging. I have not yet had a chance to do any of those activities yet.

Okeechobee is also known for its cattle industry. A couple of weeks ago we attended the Cowboy Country Rodeo. We walked there since the rodeo arena is a couple of blocks from the house. We really enjoyed it especially watching the kids try to ride sheep. We live a couple of miles from a dairy farm where we get ice cream and fresh milk. We can also stop at the stockyards and pick up some fresh beef. Most people are not aware that Florida is the largest cattle producing state.

The congregation is attached to a Preschool through Kindergarten. We have about 80 kids in the school. Karen Smith is the school administrator and has been here for 40 years! She does a fantastic job with the kids and parents, and we are so blessed to have her. Most days I greet the families as they drop the kids off in the morning. The parents are starting to get used to me and the kids are starting to know me. I have lead chapel a couple times. Grandparents' day was a huge hit and Family Fun Night brought out the families so they could "Touch a Truck".

The worshipping community is about 50 a Sunday right now, but our members are very mobile. Some are here every week, but often people go to see family, travel the US and the world, live part of the year "Up North", or go back "Up North" for hunting season and then come back home. During the winter we may double the size of the congregation. If you would like to watch one of our worship services, you can look us up on Facebook. We broadcast our services weekly. It is hard to say what our membership numbers are because during COVID they shut down completely and the congregation was vacant for three or so years. During that time they also survived a hurricane. The congregation is resilient.

As a Vicar I am in an odd situation in that I am acting in the place of a Sole Pastor. Even though I have been thrown into the deep end, the congregation is very understanding and helpful. My week consists of bulletin production, sermon preparation, shut-in and hospital visits, leading several weekly Bible studies, various meetings, community engagement, hosting get-to-know-you dinners for parishioners, special events like Family Fun Night and Okeechobee High School events, and class work for Seminary. We are required to do two hours of Language Lab studies and have a major outreach project to complete while on Vicarage. I also regularly have personal devotional time, which helps me keep my heart and mind in Christ, Jesus.

We are blessed in so many ways to be here. The congregation is very welcoming to all and has helped us make the transition. We had lived in Central Florida for about 15 years when our boys were small, and we are glad to be back. It is an adjustment, though, getting back to heat and humidity. Next week, however, the highs are supposed to be in the 70's with low humidity. This is why we like the climate. We are fine living in the tropics. If we feel like seeing colors change and feeling the cool fall air, we can fly back to the Midwest for a week and then come back to this.

Our three sons are jealous of our move and are all planning to come and see us soon. Peter (30) is still working in the restaurant business even though the place that he and his girlfriend, Isa, worked at recently burned down. We thank God that no one was hurt. William (27) is a Sergeant in the Army at Ft. Riley in Kansas.He is thinking of getting out of the Army in a year or so and is looking for direction. Steven (24) is a Sergeant in the Air Force and just returned from temporary duty in Qatar. He was glad to get back to Dover AFB in Dover, Delaware. He and his fiancé, Livy, are starting to make wedding plans.We ask God's blessing on their planning and the new family that they will form under God's care.

Deb and I are grateful for your support. We still have Seminary expenses as well as living expenses and new Pastor/ Vicar expenses. There are approximately 1,000 people moving to Florida daily. That means that housing is hard to find and expensive. God blessed us with the house we have but rent is expensive, relatively speaking. I have had to purchase quite a few Bible Commentaries and books to help with sermon and Bible study preparation. Inflation is taking its toll, though we can't complain. We thank God for every blessing, and your support is certainly one of those blessings. Thank you! May God bless you and keep you!

SUMMER YOUTH SERVICE TRIP

July 5-13, 2024 | Open to students ages 13-20 years old

We will be serving teaming up with Immanuel-Broken Arrow at an inner-city immersion program through Prince of Peace in Cincinnati, OH. At the end of the week we will have the opportunity to also visit the Creation Museum and Ark Encounter. In addition, during the week one evening we will attend an MLB ballgame of the Reds vs. Rockies (and eat dinner there). The expected cost is currently \$225.



The goal of this immersion program is to give a group of volunteers an in-depth experience of the inner city environment in which Prince of Peace Lutheran Church exists within Cincinnati. Prince of Peace is in the Over-the-Rhine neighborhood, an inner-city environment. The immersion program is intended for an extended period of time. We will sleep at Prince of Peace Lutheran Church, participate in ministry activities that occur at Prince of Peace, many of which serves the homeless and poor in Over-the-Rhine. These include "The Bridge" a day shelter program on Monday, Wednesday and Thursday from 11am-2pm and their Wednesday night community program of a devotion and community meal starting at 6pm as well as Kids Church for inner city youth on Sundays at 11:30 am.

Finally, the immersion program will give us exposure to other agencies and environments outside of Prince of Peace that serve the homeless and inner city youth in Over-the-Rhine. This includes the Freestore Foodbank and Wesley Chapel Mission Center youth outreach.

We will need commitments by those planning to attend, no later than December 1.

Young Adults


All young adults are invited to join in Bible study on Sunday mornings @ 9:40 am in the Fishbowl led by DCE Nikki, where we are using the Wired Word.



STUDENT LOAN REPAYMENT FUND






