





And I said to the man who stood at the gate of the year:

"Give me a light that I may tread safely into the unknown."

And he replied:

"Go out into the darkness and put your hand into the Hand of God.

That shall be to you better than light and safer than a known way."

So I went forth, and finding the Hand of God, trod gladly into the night.

And He led me towards the hills and the breaking of day in the lone East.

Thus reads the preamble to the poem "God Knows," written in 1908 by British poet, missionary, and academic Minnie Louise Haskins (1875-1957). The preamble gained widespread public attention in 1939 when King George VI of England quoted a portion of it in his annual Christmas radio broadcast. Lovely though the language of the well-known preamble is, the second stanza, too, is well worth reading and considering as we enter into a new year.

God knows. His will is best. The stretch of years Which wind ahead, so dim to our imperfect vision, Are clear to God. Our fears are premature; In Him, All time hath full provision.

The sentiments expressed in this poem bring to mind the words of a chorale with deep roots in the Lutheran tradition, "If Thou But Trust in God to Guide Thee." This hymn was written by German poet Georg Neumark (1621-1681) amidst the destruction and chaos of the Thirty Years' War. Through the words of Neumark's hymn, we are reminded of the comfort and hope that are ours, whatever the circumstances of our lives, through the undeserved, unchanging love of God. While we cannot know what the future holds, we live in the sure and certain hope that the One who created the universe holds our past, our present, and our future in His hands.

If thou but trust in God to guide thee And hope in Him through all thy ways,

He'll give thee strength, whate'er betide thee,

And bear thee through the evil days.

Who trusts in God's unchanging love

Builds on the rock that naught can move.

("If Thou But Trust in God to Guide Thee" LSB 750)

In closing, below is a well-known prayer of the Church that is often associated with the service of Evening Prayer, for which it serves as a concluding prayer:

Lord God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with good courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

In the coming weeks, as we begin a new year, the Sanctuary Choir will sing Carl Schalk's (1929-2021) beautiful setting of this prayer. In reading, hearing, and praying these words, may you be encouraged and strengthened for the journey. On that journey, remember your identity as a child of God: you are loved, called, redeemed, sanctified, and never, ever alone.


