Epistle

1 Corinthians 8:1–13

A The Epistle is from First Corinthians, chapter eight.

¹Concerning food offered to idols: we know that "all of us possess knowledge." This "knowledge" puffs up, but love builds up. ²If anyone imagines that he knows something, he does not yet know as he ought to know. ³But if anyone loves God, he is known by God.


⁴Therefore, as to the eating of food offered to idols, we know that "an idol has no real existence," and that "there is no God but one." ⁵For although there may be so-called gods in heaven or on earth—as indeed

there are many "gods" and many "lords"— ⁶yet for us there is one God, the Father, from whom are all things and for whom we exist, and one Lord, Jesus Christ, through whom are all things and through whom we exist.

⁷However, not all possess this knowledge. But some, through former association with idols, eat food as really offered to an idol, and their conscience, being weak, is defiled. ⁸Food will not commend us to God. We are no worse off if we do not eat, and no better off if we do. ⁹But take care that this right of yours does not somehow become a stumbling block to the weak. ¹⁰For if anyone sees you who have knowledge eating in an idol's temple, will he not be encouraged, if his conscience is weak, to eat food offered to idols? ¹¹And so by your knowledge this weak person is destroyed, the brother for whom Christ died. ¹²Thus, sinning against your brothers and wounding their conscience when it is weak, you sin against Christ. ¹³Therefore, if food makes my brother stumble, I will never eat meat, lest I make my brother stumble.

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Music Notes for January 28, 2024 – Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany

The Prelude for the Fourth Sunday after the Epiphany is a pair of piano settings of the Offertory Hymn, "Praise the One Who Breaks the Darkness" (LSB 849). These arrangements, written by American pianist Chuck Marohnic, feature rich, jazz-inflected harmonies. Marohnic, who is primarily known for his work as a jazz pianist and educator, served as Director of Jazz Studies at Arizona State University for over two decades.

The Voluntary during the gathering of the tithes and offerings at the 8:15 service is a hymn improvisation on "Oh, That I Had a Thousand Voices" (LSB 811) by American organist and composer Paul Manz (1919-2009). This improvisation, which has a lilting, pastoral quality, was inspired by the third stanza of the hymn:

You forest leaves so green and tender that dance for joy in summer air, You meadow grasses, bright and slender, you flowers so fragrant and so fair, You live to show God's praise alone. Join me to make His glory known.

The Postlude is David Cherwien's (b. 1957) vigorous and exciting chorale fugue on the Closing Hymn, "Oh, That I Had a Thousand Voices" (LSB 811). Cherwien's setting, which originated as an improvisation, is inspired by the first stanza of the hymn:

Oh, that I had a thousand voices to praise my God with thousand tongues! My heart, which in the Lord rejoices, would then proclaim in grateful songs To all, wherever I might be, what great things God has done for me.
