


OWLS---mark your calendars!

Blessings to all at the Christ the Redeemer Lutheran Church. It's been a minute since we have checked in with the membership. As the summer approaches the Father still provides for his children and we at Tulsa Saints are blessed to Glory the Father and Son through the work of the Holy Spirit. Psalm 146 states:

Praise ye the Father. Praise the Father, O my soul. While I live I will praise the Father: I will sing praises unto my God while I have any being. 3 Put not your trust in princes, nor in the son of man, in whom there is no help. 4 His breath goeth forth, he returneth to his earth; in that very day his thoughts perish. 5 Happy is he that hath the God of Jacob for his help, whose hope is in the Father his God: 6 Which made heaven, and earth, the sea, and all that therein is: which keepeth truth for ever.



The needs grow. From feeding 80-100 consistently we are seeing 100+ people regularly, even seeing large crowds on the first Friday of the month. We recently began to see many new homeless.



On one of our Friday nights, we met a man from Honduras who was eager to share his testimony. He shared about his faith and talked about how no matter where he went, the Lord always provided, and took care of his needs. He expressed his appreciation for organizations like Tulsa Saints who by the power of the Holy Spirit, strive to serve the kingdom of God and make a difference. He gave words of encouragement and shared the good news of how Jesus our King is coming back soon for His people.

Our ministry with the help of CTR and other individuals strives every Friday evening to provide clothes (see Tulsa Saints door or the TV Screens for immediate needs) and other basic needs in addition to a well balanced meal for those on the streets. We are blessed with a new larger trailer to help carry the necessary supplies and serving equipment. We will work to get it prepared and hopefully a truck that will be able to pull it someday in the future.

We are always looking for help in food preparation support or direct food and supply ministry on Friday evenings. If you want to help with food please contact Melissa James. If you would like to help with the Friday event or logistical support contact Michael Bryan.

God Bless You and thank you Messiah for changing our hearts to help those who are most in need.

As always, if you wish to come out and help we meet at Fridays 5:15 1st Baptist Care Center at 3rd and Detroit. We hand out food and supplies until we run out.




Braille

My View From the Porch


Brad Johnson Founder/Chief Visionary

Peace Choir


1st-5th Grade Wednesdays, 6:00 pm Sundays, 9:40 am



(Matthew 22:37-39).


