Fellow Redeemed,

# MUSIC MINISTRY CHOIR & HANDBELLS FOR YOUTH & ADULTS

Last month, I wrote the first in a series of articles dealing with the history and practice of sacred music in the Lutheran Church. In the October newsletter, my article centered on the 500th anniversary of the publication of the first Lutheran hymnals. This month, I will briefly examine the historic foundation of the Divine Service (*Gottesdienst*), the principal Eucharistic service of the Lutheran Church, with a particular emphasis on its roots in the Mass. I will also discuss the role that Martin Luther played in restoring active congregational participation in the liturgy and music of the Church.

Luther, the German monk who gave rise to the Protestant Reformation through a series of disputes with the Roman Catholic Church over doctrines and practices that he felt conflicted with the clear teaching of Scripture was, in contrast to some of his more iconoclastic contemporaries in the Radical Reformation and Reformed tradition, a relatively conservative reformer. Luther sought to reform the practices of the Roman Catholic Church from within, rather than start an entirely new church body. Even after his excommunication from the Roman Catholic Church in 1521, Luther retained much of the liturgy and music of the Western Mass for use in the Divine Service, excising only those components that he interpreted as being a hindrance to the scriptural, clear, and winsome proclamation of the Gospel. Indeed, Luther's *Formula missae* (1523), which provided guidelines for reforming the Latin Mass for use in the nascent Lutheran Church, and his *Deutsche Messe* (1526), which presented a German language liturgy for use by the people, resemble, in most respects, the Western rite long in use within the Roman Catholic Church.

Central to Luther's efforts to reform the Mass was the notion that the entire congregation should be able to participate fully in worship. To that end, the Scripture readings and sermons spoken by the priest were to be presented in the vernacular, in contrast to the prevailing practice within the Catholic Church of using Latin, which, by the time of the Reformation, was understood by few priests and even fewer members of the laity. In addition, vernacular hymns, Psalms, and musical settings of the liturgy, both newly composed and adapted from earlier sources, featured prominently in the Divine Service. This vernacular repertoire of sacred music was conceived to allow the congregation to regain their role as active participants in the liturgy, reinvigorating and reclaiming the legacy of congregational song that had gradually been silenced throughout the Middle Ages due to an ever-increasing emphasis on the role of the priest and the choir in the liturgy at the expense of the participation of the laity.

In next month's article, we will delve into the topic of psalmody in the Lutheran Church. It is my hope that this series of articles will give you a renewed appreciation for and deeper knowledge of the rich tradition of liturgy and song that we have inherited as Lutheran Christians. As we are gathered by the Holy Spirit around Word, font, and table, may the gifts that we receive from God in the Divine service shape and prepare us to go out into the world to live lives of love and service to God and our neighbors. *Soli Deo Gloria!* ("To God alone be the glory!").

You'll be happy to know that our U.S. partners are thankful, too. Humanitarian and social services organizations -




