Fellow Redeemed,

As we approach Reformation Day, we are reminded of the monumental events that shaped our Christian faith five centuries The over ago. Protestant Reformation, ignited by Martin Luther's courageous stand against the prevailing practices of the Church, was not merely a historical event but a divine movement that restored the purity of the Gospel message. It brought the light of God's Word back to the forefront, reminding us that salvation is by grace alone, through faith alone, in Christ alone.

The Heart of the Reformation

The Reformation was more than just a theological dispute; it was a call to return to the core truths of Scripture. Luther's 95 Theses challenged the Church to examine its teachings and practices, holding them against the

authority of the Bible. He called for a return to the simplicity and purity of the Gospel, free from the corruption and abuses that had crept into the Church over the centuries.

But Luther's message was not only for the institution of the Church; it was also for individuals. He emphasized that faith is personal—a direct relationship between the believer and God. This principle of \*sola fide\* (faith alone) challenged Christians to examine their own lives, to reform their personal faith, and to ensure that it was rooted in the Word of God.

The Need for Personal Reformation

Just as the Church of Luther's time needed reformation, so too do we today need to examine our hearts...

and lives. The Reformation calls each of us to a personal transformation—a reformation of our own faith and daily living.

In the hustle and bustle of modern life, it's easy to lose sight of our spiritual priorities. We can become complacent, allowing the pressures of work, family, society, and yes, social media to overshadow our commitment to Christ. But the message of the Reformation compels us to pause, reflect, and ask ourselves:

- •Is my faith truly centered on Christ alone?
- •Am I allowing the Word of God to shape my beliefs and actions?
- •Am I living out the grace and love of God in my relationships with others?

The Reformation reminds us that our walk with Christ is a daily journey of renewal. It calls us to continually reform our lives, bringing them into greater alignment with God's will. This involves a constant return to Scripture, a renewed commitment to prayer, and an absolute reliance on the Holy Spirit to guide and transform us.

## Embracing the Spirit of Reformation

As we commemorate the Protestant Reformation this year, let us embrace its spirit not just as a historical event, but as a living challenge to our hearts. Just as Luther stood firm in his faith against the pressures of his time, we too are called to stand firm in our faith today, resisting the secular currents that seek to pull us away from our Savior.

Let this season be a time of personal reformation, where we recommit ourselves to the truths of the Gospel, where we seek to live out our faith with renewed passion and purpose. May we be ever vigilant in guarding our hearts, ensuring that they are wholly devoted to Christ, and may we, like Luther, find our courage in the Lord, standing boldly in the truth of His Word.

# MUSIC MINISTRY

## Choir & Handbells for Youth & Adults

In October 2017, Lutheran congregations around the world celebrated the 500th anniversary of the Reformation. This year, we celebrate another important milestone: the 500th anniversary of the publication of the first Lutheran hymnals. For Martin Luther (1483-1546), music was no mere aural accessory to adorn or beautify the liturgy of the Church. Rather, music, which Luther viewed as a creation and gift of God for His people to use in praise and adoration, was indispensable in Christian worship.

In the Lutheran tradition, music, when joined to the Word of God, serves as a means for God's people to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Nowhere is this seen more clearly than in the singing of congregational hymns. In joining our voices in songs of praise and proclamation, we participate in and become part of what Luther called *viva vox evangelii*, that is, the "living voice of the Gospel."

Hymnody has remained vital to Lutheran worship for over five centuries. From the earliest days of the Reformation, Luther was committed to the task of providing a body of vernacular hymnody suitable for congregational singing. To that end, he actively sought the assistance of gifted poets and composers, whom he considered to be more well-equipped for the task than himself, encouraging them to write hymns for the Church. Luther's own hymnic contributions and his encouragement of the poetic and musical efforts of others led to the publication of the first Lutheran hymnals in 1524.

The first Lutheran hymnal, *Etlich Cristlich lider* ("Some Christian Songs"), was published in Nürnberg. Born out of a collaboration between Luther and Paul Speratus (1484-1551), this hymnal contained just eight hymns. Three of those hymns, Luther's "Dear Christians, One and All, Rejoice" (LSB 556) and "From Depths of Woe I Cry to Thee" (LSB 607), and Speratus's "Salvation Unto Us Has Come" (LSB 555), are found in *Lutheran Service Book*, the present hymnal of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod.

Shortly after the publication of *Etlich Cristlich lider*, the second Lutheran hymnal, the *Erfrurt Enchiridion*, was published. The *Enchiridion*, meaning handbook, was published in Erfurt by two competing printers, Johannes Loersfeld and Matthes Maler. In addition to hymns of Luther and Speratus, including those that were published in *Etlich Cristlich lider*, the *Enchiridion* contains hymns by Elisabeth Cruciger (c. 1500-1535), Justus Jonas (1494-1555), and Erhard Hegenwald (first half of the 16th century). Fourteen of the twenty-six hymns found in the *Enchiridion* are included in *Lutheran Service Book*.

The first Wittenberg hymnal, *Eyn Geystliche gesangk Buchleyn* ("A Spiritual Songbook"), was compiled and edited by the composer and poet Johann Walter (1496-1570). This hymnal, which opens with a preface written by Martin Luther, is the first German hymnal to include hymns harmonized for choral singing, marking the beginning of Lutheran choral music. The first edition of *Eyn geystlich Gesangk Buchleyn* contains thirty-two German hymns in polyphonic settings for three to five voice parts. In addition, it includes several sacred songs in Latin. In contrast to the modern hymnic practice of placing the hymn tune in the soprano, Walter places the melody in the tenor voice. Eighteen of the hymns contained in Walter's hymnal are found in *Lutheran Service Book*.

As Lutheran Christians, we have indeed inherited a rich treasury of hymnody. Today, just as much as 500 years ago, congregational song is a living, vital component of worship through which Jesus Christ, crucified, risen, and ascended, is proclaimed as Lord. In many ways, our faith is shaped, formed, and nurtured by the songs that we sing. Through the Church's song, we engage in the entire story of salvation in all its richness and complexity. May the songs we sing always point to the One to whom they are addressed, and may we never cease to "proclaim the wonders God has done" (LSB 556:1). Alleluia! Amen.



## When is it?

Gathering dates are July 19-23, 2025. Please keep open July 17-24 at this time as we make travel and special event arrangements. Once the dates are firm, we will update that information.

## **REGISTRATION INFORMATION:**

Our registration MUST be mailed on November 1, 2024 to meet the early deadline. Beforehand, we need each student to complete the necessary registration form as well as receive signatures from a parent and our Pastor. Early Registration is \$395 per person. If you choose to attend after November 1, 2025 your cost is \$475 per person.

#### **Early Registration Pay Schedule:**

A \$175 non-refundable deposit per person is due by August 25 or you may pay the full \$395.

A second payment of \$120 is due by December 31. A third and final payment of \$100 is due by March 1.


#### **Late Registration Pay Schedule:**

A \$275 non-refundable deposit per person is due by upon registration or you may pay the full \$475.

A second payment of \$100 is due by December 31. A third and final payment of \$100 is due by March 1.

Once you commit to going you are responsible for any costs associated with you going on the trip that the church pays in your name. If you decide at a later date to not go, you must find someone to take your place or you will be responsible for reimbursing Christ the Redeemer for any funds paid in your name above your registration fee. This includes: hotel costs, transportation costs, special event tickets, t-shirts, etc.






# SAVE THE DATE




