Music Notes for July 20, 2025 – Sixth Sunday after Pentecost

Thank you to CTR member Daphnee Brian for serving as guest musician this Sunday!

The Prelude for the Sixth Sunday after Pentecost is a lyrical and expressive setting of the Offertory Hymn, "We Give Thee but Thine Own" (LSB 781), by American organist William H. Bates (b. 1943). Dr. Bates, longtime Professor of Organ and Music History at the University of South Carolina, holds degrees in organ and church music from Howard Payne University and the Jacobs School of Music at Indiana University.

The Voluntary is a flowing, gentle arrangement of the Distribution Hymn, "Lord of All Hopefulness" (LSB 738) by American composer and organist Steven Wente (b. 1952). Dr. Wente is Distinguished Professor of Music Emeritus at Concordia University Chicago and serves as Cantor at First Saint Paul's Lutheran Church in Chicago.

The Communion Voluntary is *A Blessing*, a reflective composition by Florence Moody Robertson.

The Postlude is a setting of the Closing Hymn, "How Firm a Foundation" (LSB 728) by J. Wayne Kerr (b. 1958). Rev. Kerr, a Lutheran pastor who has composed extensively for handbells, organ, and choir, served the Church as an educator, pastor, and church musician for over forty years.
