



MUSIC MINISTRY

CHOIR & HANDBELLS FOR YOUTH & ADULTS
BY JACOB DRENGLER

As we prepare to enter into the joy of the Easter season later this month, we return to our ongoing exploration of the Hymns of the Season. Hopefully, the information I share in these articles regarding the origins of the texts and melodies we sing together deepens your appreciation for the rich treasury of theology, poetry, and music that is the Church's hymnody.

Few Christian festivals have inspired so great a body of hymnody as Easter Sunday, that day when we are gathered by the Holy Spirit to celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord. As such, selecting a single Hymn of the Season to focus on for the fifty days of the Easter season was no easy task. Since many of the Easter hymns in *Lutheran Service Book* are already widely sung and beloved by many Christian communities, I opted to select a hymn that is more recently composed and less well-known. The Hymn of the Season for Easter is "Our Paschal Lamb, That Sets Us Free" (LSB 473).

"Our Paschal Lamb, That Sets Us Free" was written by Martin Franzmann (1907-1976). Franzmann, a Lutheran pastor, theologian, seminary professor, and hymnist, is best known to members of the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod for his great hymn "Thy Strong Word Did Cleave the Darkness" (LSB 578), which he wrote for Concordia Seminary, St. Louis in 1954.

Completed in 1974, two years before Franzmann's death, the writing of "Our Paschal Lamb, That Sets Us Free" was prompted by an invitation from Augsburg Publishing House. At the time, Augsburg Publishing House, the official publishing house of the American Lutheran Church, was cooperating with the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod and the Lutheran Church in America in the Inter-Lutheran Commission on Worship, working toward the publication of the common hymnal that would become the *Lutheran Book of Worship* (1978). Between 1973 and 1975, Augsburg Publishing House instituted a two-year series of newly composed Hymns of the Month in order to encourage Franzmann and other notable contemporary Lutheran hymn writers and composers to create a fresh body of distinctly Lutheran hymnody. Although "Our Paschal Lamb, That Sets Us Free" was written at the request of Augsburg in the lead-up to the publication of *Lutheran Book of Worship*, it was not included in LBW. Instead, it was first widely introduced to LC-MS congregations in *Hymnal Supplement 98*, wherein it was joined to REGION THREE, a majestic hymn tune by Dr. Walter Pelz (b. 1926), Professor Emeritus of Music at Bethany College, Lindsborg, Kansas.

Franzmann's hymn text, which recalls the sacrificial death and glorious resurrection of Jesus Christ, the Lamb of God, is based on 1 Corinthians 5:7-8:

For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed. Let us therefore celebrate the festival, not with the old leaven, the leaven of malice and evil, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

Under our risen Lord's righteous reign, we live lives of true freedom, freed from sin and death, washed in the life-giving waters of Baptism, and nurtured by His gifts of body and blood. We are freed from the chains of sin, fear, and doubt to live lives of love and service to God and our neighbors. As we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord, may we join our voices with all of creation in thanksgiving for the wondrous things He has done for us! Alleluia! Amen.

1. Capital projects.

·The new roofs over the gym, west classroom wing and center area and the new gym rooftop HVAC have been completed.

·We have received two bids for resurfacing the asphalt parking lot and are waiting on one to two more before submitting to the BOD and Endowment Fund board

·We are beginning the process of requesting bids to repaint and weatherproof the exterior of the sanctuary and bell tower.

·We are considering light improvements in choir loft for the bells.

· We are planning on installing door view lights in the existing sanctuary to narthex wood doors after Easter.

·We are considering replacement of existing front sign with new sign that is more visible and would give us the option to update the information displayed.

2. General Maintenance

Jan-Pro Cleaning Service has agreed to begin using a floor scrubber to improve the appearance and cleanliness of our flooring.

 $\cdot \text{We}$ are researching a robot vacuum for sanctuary that will keep the flooring more consistently clean.

 \cdot We have moved our HVAC service agreement to Air Assurance as we have been pleased with the installation work, they have done for us and were less expensive than the previous HVAC service company.

·Review of this year's Property Liability Insurance costs and increase in deductible.

·We changed the elevator maintenance agreement to a monthly agreement that will provide a superior warranty repair option. This allowed replacement of the seal on the hydraulic lift cylinder at a lower cost than originally quoted us.


