Maggie Merrill Booker T Washington


Maggie graduated from Booker T Washington and is going to the University of Wisconsin-Madison to study Biomedical Engineering.

MUSIC MINISTRY

CHOIR & HANDBELLS FOR YOUTH & ADULTS BY JACOB DRENGLER

This month, I would like to provide a brief introduction to the German composer Johanna Senfter (1879-1961). Senfter's life and work are the subject of my in-progress doctoral dissertation. My document is tentatively titled "A Stylistic and Performance Analysis of *Variationen über den Choral 'Morgenglanz der Ewigkeit*,' op. 66 by Johana Senfter." The purpose of this study is to provide a detailed analysis of Senfter's *Variationen über den Choral "Morgenglanz der Ewigkeit"* op. 66. To date, limited research has been conducted on the life and compositional output of Johanna Senfter. Although a number of publications provide biographical information on Senfter, alongside brief descriptions of her broader compositional style, no significant research document has been written on her compositions for solo organ. The solo organ works of Johanna Senfter are substantial, well-crafted compositions that merit thorough research and analysis.

Johanna Senfter produced a substantial corpus of compositions written in a late-Romantic style. Beginning during her years as a student of Max Reger at the Royal Conservatory of Music in Leipzig and continuing into the early decades of her professional career, Senfter's compositions were well-received and widely performed in Germany, including successful performances in Oppenheim, Darmstadt, Wiesbaden, Erbach, Bad Nauheim, and Mainz in the 1920s and 1930s. She enjoyed a period of even greater popular acclaim during the Second World War, with several of her major works receiving premiere performances throughout Germany and in Luxembourg. However, in the years following the cessation of the Second World War, Senfter largely withdrew from public life, and her output as a composer dwindled.

Johanna Senfter's *oeuvre* consists of at least 134 works with opus numbers and numerous works without opus numbers, comprising compositions in all major genres save for opera. Included in this impressive output are nine symphonies, four piano trios, five string quartets, eight violin sonatas, a viola concerto, three violin concerti, a piano concerto, and a myriad of other compositions, including numerous *lieder*, choral works, pieces for solo piano and organ, and chamber music written for a wide array of instrumentations. While the majority of Senfter's manuscripts are held in the library of the Cologne University of Music, as of the writing of this article no complete index of her compositional output exists and many of her works remain unpublished.

Although Senfter lived well into the second half of the twentieth century, her compositional style, which was influenced by such luminaries of the Germanic musical firmament as Johann Sebastian Bach, Johannes Brahms, and Max Reger, remained set resolutely in a late-Romantic idiom throughout her long career. As an "avowed opponent of the avant-garde and atonal music," Senfter's works primarily employed well-established formal structures and procedures such as fugue, sonata, and variation form. Further, while she utilized a highly chromatic, at times strikingly dissonant harmonic language in many of her compositions, Senfter never exceeded the boundaries of tonality. This decidedly conservative compositional palette was an asset to

Senfter's career during the Second World War, when those guiding the political and cultural currents of wartime Germany balked at the perceived modernism of compositions by the members of the Second Viennese School and their acolytes. However, it was significantly less helpful in the face of the changing German musical landscape of the post-war years.

Given Senfter's close association with Max Reger, an incredibly prolific composer of music for the organ, it is hardly surprising that her compositions for the organ are often viewed within the context of her experience as a pupil of Reger. This connection is further strengthened by her proclivity for utilizing Lutheran chorales in her works for solo organ, a trait she shared with her professor. However, Senfter's compositions for the organ, though they are substantial works of considerable technical difficulty, comprise a relatively small portion of her total compositional output and most seem to have originated well after the period during which she studied with Reger. Senfter's works for solo organ include the Fantasia und Fugue über "Wie Schoen leuchtet der Morgenstern," op. 30a, Variationen über den Choral "Morgenglanz der Ewigkeit," op. 66, three collections of short chorale preludes (op. 30b, op. 70, and op. 73), and Andante, Vorspiel und Doppelfuge in d-Moll.

The compositions of Johanna Senfter merit renewed attention from scholars, performers, and audiences. Senfter's chorale-based works for organ, which include large-scale works suitable for concert use and pieces of a more modest scale that are eminently well-suited for use in ecclesiastical settings, are exceptional examples of the late-Romantic German school of composition. Despite the high level of quality of her work, much of her compositional output has remained virtually unknown in the decades since her death, with many of her pieces remaining unpublished. It is my hope that increased emphasis on the study of Senfter's life and work will lead to a greater interest in the publication and recording of her compositions, making her music more readily available and accessible to performers, analysts, and listeners alike. I have truly enjoyed learning more about this undeservedly neglected composer and would encourage readers of this article to visit YouTube to explore recordings of Senfter's beautiful music.



summer! There's a need for helpers to get these homes ready and volunteers of all skills are really needed.



The Barn construction begins!

We hope to start construction on the 4,000' barn soon, which will be the centerpiece of our Eden Farm. It will be built on the south side of our 17-acre property, which is zoned AG. Our barn will serve as farm storage, wood and metal shop, vegetable processing area, art studio, and living quarters for our resident Farm Manager. Our

two Livestock Guardian dogs, Sampson and Ellie, will call the barn home. We're so excited to have the funding for this and look forward to having a big grand opening in July....we hope. We are looking for a retired farmer, someone with extensive horticulture experience, and leadership skills to serve as our **volunteer Farm Manager.** We need someone to be the "trail boss" at our farm, so let us know if you know of anyone who wants to be part of this unique program.

This is one of the 275 blackberry plants we planted a few weeks ago with the help of volunteers. It's not impressive now, but next year, they will produce over 2,000 of pounds of fresh blackberries, to be sold at farmers markets or made into blackberry jam to sell. Some of our residents will form a little blackberry mini-business, will be responsible for caring for them,

harvesting, and selling. We project to gross over \$20K annually, just from this venture
