Fellow Redeemed.

Recently, I have been brushing up on my systematic theology, using Francis Pieper's Christian Dogmatics. It is the text we used at Seminary for all of our Systematic Theology classes.

You might ask, what is theology? Is it the domain of professors, pastors, and dusty books? Or is it something much more alive, essential, and deeply connected to our life of faith? Reflecting on Dr. Francis Pieper's work in Christian Dogmatics, especially Chapter 8 on "Christian Theology," we are reminded that theology is not an academic luxury but the very lifeblood of the Church's confession.

Pieper reminds us that Christian theology is the knowledge of God drawn from God's own self-revelation—His Word. In a world that often tries to reason its way to God through human philosophy, feelings, or speculation, Pieper firmly anchors theology in Holy Scripture alone. True Christian theology receives, it does not invent. It listens humbly, rather than constructing its own ideas about who God is.

Thus, theology is not first and foremost a human search for God; it is a reception of God's gracious self-giving in Christ. Pieper makes it clear: the purpose of theology is not to entertain curiosities, but to proclaim the saving Gospel of Jesus Christ. True theology always serves the ministry of Word and Sacrament, where Christ Himself forgives, strengthens, and gathers His Church.

Moreover, Pieper insists that theology is for faith. It is not just a collection of correct statements (although right doctrine is crucial), but a living, saving knowledge that clings to Christ. Theology exists so that sinners may know their Savior and find their confidence, not in themselves, but entirely in God's mercy revealed through Christ crucified and risen.

This has profound implications for us at CTR. It means that every sermon, Bible study, Catechism class, and hymn is not merely "religious information," but the living theology that delivers Christ to us. It also means that each one of us, not just pastors or teachers, is called to be a theologian in the truest sense—one who hears God's Word, trusts in it, and confesses it before the world.

Pieper's reflections ultimately call us back to the heart of our faith: Christ for us. Theology is for the comfort of troubled consciences, for the building up of the Church, and for the glory of God. May we, as a congregation, treasure this rich gift of Christian theology, not as a cold set of doctrines, but as the living truth of the Gospel that gives life to the world.

"Let the Word of Christ dwell in you richly" (Colossians 3:16).





# MUSIC MINISTRY

CHOIR & HANDBELLS FOR YOUTH & ADULTS BY JACOB DRENGLER

Many readers of these monthly newsletter articles are likely aware that since the fall of 2021, I have been working toward the completion of the Doctor of Musical Arts (DMA) degree in Organ Performance at the University of Oklahoma. But what exactly is a DMA? What sorts of things does one have to do in order to earn a DMA? How close is the author of this article to completing the requirements for the DMA? In this month's article, I shall endeavor to answer all of these questions.

The DMA is a terminal academic degree in the field of music. The DMA is, along with the Doctor of Music Education (DME) and Doctor of Philosophy (PhD), the highest-level academic degree awarded in music. While the DME and PhD tend to emphasize the fields of musicology, music theory, ethnomusicology, music therapy, and music education, the DMA centers on an applied area of specialization, such as music performance, composition, or conducting. Although all three degree types generally culminate in a written dissertation or thesis, the PhD and DME are more research-oriented, while the DMA includes a more rigorous performance component.

The DMA requires a minimum of 90 credit hours of academic work beyond the bachelor's degree. Typically, approximately 32 of those hours are completed during the master's degree. The DMA in Organ Performance at OU includes coursework that is required of all doctoral students in music, as well as several courses unique to the organ degree program. In terms of organ-specific course work, I have taken History and Fundamentals of Pipe Organ Construction and Design and three semesters of Organ Literature, covering the full gamut of pipe organ repertoire from the Renaissance to the present day. In addition, I took six semesters of applied doctoral organ lessons. The organ performance aspect of the degree culminated in the performance of three required hour-long solo organ degree recitals, which were presented in the Spring 2022, 2023, and 2024 semesters.

Other coursework required for the DMA includes studies in music theory, musicology, and music literature. While the required number of credit hours is the same for each student, the actual coursework taken varies from student to student and is dependent on their particular areas of research, study, and interest. For my music theory coursework, I took Analysis of Tonal Music, Theorizing Global Musics, and Analysis of 20<sup>th</sup>-Century Music. My musicology and music literature studies included Hymnody, World Organs in the Last 350 Years, Early Modernist Opera, Music and European Courts, and Bibliography and Research. I completed all of the required coursework for the degree with the completion of my final degree recital in Spring 2024.

In addition to the required preliminary exams, coursework, and recitals, DMA students are also required to complete the General Examination before beginning work on their doctoral thesis. The General Exam is a comprehensive series of written and oral tests that are designed to determine that a doctoral student has acquired expertise in their major area and possesses a thorough general knowledge of music. Further, the General Exam requires the student to express this specialized knowledge clearly in both writing and extemporaneous speaking and to synthesize information from various areas of musical study. The General Exam consists of six separate written tests in musicology, music theory, research design and analysis, musical styles, and two tests drawing from topics germane to the student's major area of study. The written exams are followed by an oral examination administered by the student's doctoral advisory committee, which consists of four faculty members from the School of Music and a fifth faculty member from another academic unit within the university. I finished the General Exam in November 2024, establishing my candidacy for the DMA, meaning that the proposal, writing, and defense of my doctoral thesis is the lone degree requirement remaining for me to complete.

# MUSIC MINISTRY CONTINUED...

Prior to completing and defending the doctoral thesis document, DMA students are required to submit a proposal document to their advisory committee. This proposal is meant to provide an outline of the subject matter that the student intends to explore in their dissertation. The proposal also should establish that the proposed topic of the study represents scholarship that makes an original contribution to the doctoral candidate's field of study. In addition to outlining the purpose of the proposed research, the methodology and parameters of the study, and a review of existing scholarly literature related to the topic of the study, the proposal must also include sample chapters of the proposed thesis document. Upon completion of the document proposal, it must be submitted to and approved by the members of the student's doctoral committee. Following approval of the proposal, the student proceeds to complete the document before submitting a final draft to their committee. The final step in the process is an oral defense of the thesis document before the candidate's advisory committee. I am currently working on my document proposal, which I hope to have completed and prepared to defend by sometime early in the Fall 2025 semester. In next month's article, I will offer a brief introduction to the German composer Johanna Senfter (1879-1961), whose life and organ music will be the subject of my dissertation.


"Your Word is a lamp to guide my feet and a light for my path." Psalm 119:105


# THIRD SUNDAY Family Funday

# **Eden Village**

Spring has Sprung! And with it a 4<sup>th</sup> Neighborhood!

May 2025

Spring is here at Eden Village, with signs of new growth in the landscaping and new residents moving in off the streets. Our first 3 neighborhoods are filling up with about 21 folks living here now.



<u>Neighborhood #4</u> foundations are done, with 9 new tiny homes being delivered next week, bringing us up to 36 homes. We've selected 36 people, from the over 600 applications so far, to become residents at Eden Village, so we expect to be full by late April. Prime Craftsmen Builders out of Skiatook are constructing our final 27 homes as we speak, set to be done by this fall.



It's a testament to the hard work and support of many in our community to take this 17 acres of weeds, trash, and an abandoned

homeless camp into what it is becoming now. You just need to come and see what has been created with God's blessings. We are open for tours on Wednesdays and Fridays around noon.



We're not going to solve our homeless problem in Tulsa just with our 63 tiny homes, but we will solve it for our 63 formerly homeless friends. That's a good start.

# We're Having a Barn Raising!



We're making some progress on raising funds for the barn on our 7-acre working farm on the south part of our land. It's been zoned AG (probably the first-time land in Tulsa has gone from a residential to AG zoning) and ready to go. The total project will take about \$400k to develop. Right now we have a wonderful opportunity to get matching funds for the Barn itself. A local foundation has provided a \$70K matching grant to help build the barn, so we need to raise \$70K

this spring in order to receive this and start construction on the barn. And, we're seeking more support to finish out this farm project so that we'll at least have the infrastructure and the start of what will be a thriving agriculture application soon. This is just some of the great news that's coming out of the Eden Village Tulsa. Be sure and check out their website, Facebook page and on Instagram!
