As We Gather As we observe Reformation Day this morning, you may notice that one of our banners is adorned with the letters VDMA. VDMA is an acronym that stands for the Latin phrase *Verbum Domini Manet in Aeternum* ("the Word of the Lord endures forever"), which was used as a motto by the Lutheran reformers from as early as 1522. This phrase appears in Isaiah 40:8 and was also used by the Apostle Peter in his first epistle (1 Peter 1:24-25). Both scripture passages refer to the eternal faithfulness of God and His Word. Through these words, we are reminded that God has spoken the living Word of His grace in Jesus Christ and has overcome sin, death, and the devil. To God alone be the glory!



¹⁹Now we know that whatever the law says it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be stopped, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. ²⁰For by works of the law no human being will be justified in his sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin.

²¹But now the righteousness of God has been manifested apart from the law, although the Law and the Prophets bear witness to it— ²²the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction: ²³for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God, ²⁴and are justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, ²⁵whom God put forward as a propitiation by his

blood, to be received by faith. This was to show God's righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over former sins. ²⁶It was to show his righteousness at the present time, so that he might be just and the justifier of the one who has faith in Jesus.

²⁷Then what becomes of our boasting? It is excluded. By what kind of law? By a law of works? No, but by the law of faith. ²⁸For we hold that one is justified by faith apart from works of the law.

Service of the Sacrament


