Fellow Redeemed.

As the autumn leaves fall and we approach the season of Thanksgiving, it's natural for our minds to turn toward gratitude. We gather around tables, share meals with loved ones, and pause, if only for a moment, to give thanks for the blessings of the year. But for followers of Christ, Thanksgiving isn't just a day on the calendar. It's a posture of the heart. In fact, it's at the very core of our worship.

The word "worship" comes from the Old English worth-ship, meaning to ascribe worth to someone or something. When we worship God, we are acknowledging His supreme worth, His goodness, His faithfulness, and His love. And one of the clearest ways we do that is through thanksgiving.

Throughout Scripture, thanksgiving is inseparable from worship. The Psalms are filled with calls to "give thanks to the Lord, for He is good; His love endures forever" (Psalm 107:1). Paul exhorts believers to "give thanks in all circumstances" (1 Thessalonians 5:18) and reminds the church in Colossae that we are to "sing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs with thankfulness in our hearts to God" (Colossians 3:16).

True worship is not confined to a song, a service, or a sermon. It is a life lived in gratitude to the One who gave us everything, even His own Son. When we gather on Sundays and lift our voices, we are offering more than melodies, we are offering hearts full of thanks. When we serve, give, and love others, we are worshiping through thanksgiving in action.

This Thanksgiving season, we will be intentional about turning our gratitude into worship. Let's not just thank God for what He's done, but adore Him for who He is. Whether in times of plenty or in seasons of struggle, may our lives echo the words of the Psalmist: "I will give thanks to the Lord with my whole heart; I will recount all of your wonderful deeds" (Psalm 9:1).

Let our worship be more than a weekly rhythm, let it be a daily response to the goodness and grace of God. Because when we truly understand who He is, we can't help but give thanks. Amen!

Lutheran World Relief Collection Delivered

Monday, October 6th was the loading day at CTR of all our donations going to Lutheran World Relief. We also received donations from the Miami Zone churches and the Tulsa churches to take to the collection point at Messiah Lutheran in OKC. Our CTR totals were 213 Quilts, 126 Health kits, 311 School Kits, 14 Sewing Kits, and 6 Layette Kits for a total of 1856 pounds. Braving the construction on the turnpike, Barb Sprunger and Patti Ross drove the U-Haul truck filled with 2876 pounds of goods to OKC. The truck from LWR warehouse in south St. Paul, MN, was loaded with the help of the 7th and 8th grade classes from Messiah's school. What a great group of kids!







It was very well organized, and we enjoyed visiting with folks from Newkirk and Enid who were dropping off their donations. The people from Newkirk brought theirs in the trailer they use to transport their show goats. Yes, they raise and show goats! Enid's came in a pickup towing a trailer from Redeemer, Enid. After a stop for lunch (barbeque) Barb and Patti drove home, turned in the truck, and called it done until next year! All thanks to God!

Collecting pop tabs is a great way to teach kids about philanthropy and the importance of recycling, as well as raise funds to help children and their families. Schools, service organizations, churches, businesses and individuals collect pop tabs for the Ronald McDonald House of Tulsa. Thousands of dollars can be raised each year with pop tab collections!

Why only the tabs?

Well, the tabs are made of different quality aluminum than the cans and are more easily recycled. They are smaller and cleaner than collecting cans. They are also easier for us to handle when receiving large volumes. The amount of money received is determined by the weight of aluminum collected. These pop tabs can make a big impact when collected in numbers. Money received is not credited toward any medical treatment.

Some Fun Facts

1 pound of aluminum is sold for approximately 60¢ (current price)

1,267 pop tabs make 1 pound

1 inch = 1 pop tab

1 foot = 12 pop tabs

1 mile = 63,360 pop tabs

HOW DO I PARTICIPATE?

Collecting pop tabs couldn't be easier! Collect pop tabs until you fill your container, then drop them off at the Ronald McDonald House of Tulsa. Pop tabs may be delivered to the House between 9 a.m. and 8 p.m. daily.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT?

After the tabs are collected, the Ronald McDonald House of Tulsa takes the pop tabs to local recycling centers, where they are weighed to determine their value. The recycling center then sends the Ronald McDonald House of Tulsa a check for the total value.
