



Matthew 3:1-12

¹In those days John the Baptist came preaching in the wilderness of Judea, ²"Repent, for the kingdom of heaven is at hand." ³For this is he who was spoken of by the prophet Isaiah when he said,

"The voice of one crying in the wilderness:

'Prepare the way of the Lord; make his paths straight.'" ⁴Now John wore a garment of camel's hair and a leather belt around his waist, and his food was locusts and wild honey. ⁵Then Jerusalem and all Judea and all the region about the Jordan were going out to him, ⁶ and they were baptized by him in the river Jordan, confessing their sins.

⁷But when he saw many of the Pharisees and Sadducees coming for baptism, he said to them, "You brood of vipers! Who warned you to flee from the wrath to come? ⁸Bear fruit in keeping with repentance. ⁹And do not presume to say to yourselves, 'We have Abraham as our father,' for I tell you, God is able from these stones to raise up children for Abraham. ¹⁰Even now the axe is laid to the root of the trees. Every tree therefore that does not bear good fruit is cut down and thrown into the fire.

He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and with fire. ¹²His winnowing fork is in his hand, and he will clear his threshing floor and gather his wheat into the barn, but the chaff he will burn with unquenchable fire."


Service of the Sacrament

The Lord's Supper is celebrated in the confession that we receive not just bread and wine but the true body and blood of our Lord Jesus Christ, which we eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins, life and salvation. Holy Communion also signifies a unity of faith and belief with those who gather at this altar. Baptized Christians who share the confession of the Lutheran church are welcome at the Lord's Table. If you are unsure what you believe or have questions, we invite you to speak with the Elder on duty or the Pastor before the service. Grape juice is available in the center circle of the individual cup trays.


The Words of Our Lord







We accomplish this by *BEING THERE* for people through our main ministries: Hearts of Mercy & Compassion, Human Care, Crisis Response, K-9 Comfort Dogs, and Disaster Response.

Hearts of Mercy & Compassion

Hearts of Mercy & Compassion® (HMC) provides a physical and spiritual symbol through the giving of hearts and crosses to families and friends who have suffered a loss or are experiencing the illness of a loved one. An HMC can also be given to celebrate a victory, honor service, as an expression of love, or as encouragement. Given as a gift, each HMC provides the love and hope of Jesus through presence and prayer.















Human Care

The Human Care Ministry shares specific appeals to the LCC donor community to help individuals, clergy support staff, and congregations. Support may be financial, in-kind donations, people resources, emotional and spiritual. Through LCMS congregations, LCC's Human Care Ministry supports soup kitchens, food pantries and lending closets, refugees, and veterans just to name a few.







Crisis Response

Our world is hurting and anxious. Our family, friends, and neighbors are struggling with issues ranging from everyday stress to urgent crises, even mass trauma. They need effective support now more than ever. That's why Lutheran Church Charities is training its volunteers in **Spiritual First Aid**.

SFA is an emotional care program that is biblically based and psychologically sound, rooted in years of research and testing. Created by the Wheaton College Humanitarian Disaster Institute, SFA equips people to respond and serve others in crisis with a listening, caring, and empathetic presence as spiritual first responders.



LCC facilitates training and certification in Spiritual First Aid so that pastors, church workers, deacons, deaconesses, and parish nurses can show care with confidence to their congregations and communities.



K-9 Comfort Dogs

The LCC K-9 Comfort Dog Ministry embraces the unique, calming nature and skills of pure-bred Golden Retrievers. LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs are working animals, trained by LCC to interact with people of all ages and circumstances. After they complete 2,000 hours of training, dogs are permanently placed with LCMS churches by LCC. Permanent placement includes full training for handlers and caregivers along with ongoing support, coaching, and training.

The LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs are a bridge for compassionate ministry, opening doors for conversation about faith and creating opportunities to share the mercy, compassion, presence, and proclamation of Jesus Christ. The LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs serve every day in the community in which they are placed and are deployed in times of disaster and crisis to bring comfort to all those affected, including first responders. Lutheran Church Charities currently has over 130 LCC K-9 Comfort Dogs serving in more than 27 states.

Disaster Response

LCC Disaster Response deploys, coordinates, and manages volunteer teams as they respond to disasters throughout the United States.



LCC trains volunteer Lutheran Early Response Teams (LERT) through our LCMS congregations. Approximately 850 active LCC LERT volunteers are trained, many with expertise with chainsaws, heavy equipment, debris removal, flood recovery, mucking homes, and providing emotional and spiritual care.

When disaster strikes, these teams may be asked to deploy in 72 hours or less to the disaster site. LERT volunteers also support their communities by doing clean-up work for members of their congregations and churches.
